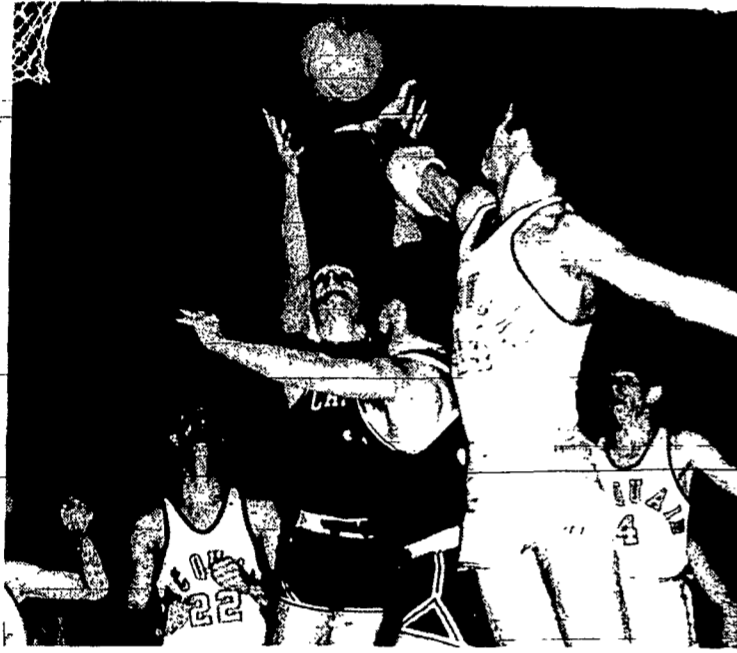
Champion Mooney Paces Four Teams Into Semifinals

Regular season champion Cardinal Mooney breezed to a 53-20 victory over DeSales of Geneva last week in the quarterfinals of the 11th annual Diocesan Basketball Tournament and will face Notre Dame of Elmira at 8:30 p.m. in tomorrow night's semifinals at Monroe Community College.

The other semifinal game tomorrow night pits St. Anthony of Padua from Watkins, Glen against McQuaid High School at 7 p.m. The winners will play for the championship at 2 p.m. Sunday at Monroe Community College.

Notre Dame reached the semifinals by dumping Aquinas Institute, 79-54, in the quarterfinal round.

St. Anthony's defeated Bishop Kearney, 85-80 to gain semifinals and McQuaid ousted Mt. Carmel of Auburn, 59-38.
