The Special Child

A religious education program should include these aims for parents: to instill in them an understanding that their child has the opportunity to participate in the Christian community to the fullest extent of his ability; and to give them insight and understanding in the role and value of their child in the Church.

Such a program should provide information to the whole parish that will facilitate the acceptance of the special child into the Christian family. And it should educate the parish regarding both mental retardation and the special needs of the retarded child, namely, total acceptance, love and concern.

The following organizations can provide valuable assistance to a parish organizing or carrying on a special child program:

- The National Association for Retarded Children, 420 Lexington Ave., N.Y., N.Y. 10017. (You, a local county chapter, of that organization directs itself to parents as well as professionals; and is familiar with your particular situation.)
- New York State Association of Retarded Children, 175 5th Ave., N.Y., N.Y. 10010.
- The county Mental Health Clinic, Welfare Department, and Public Health nurses.
- Local physicians and rehabilitation centers.
- The National Apostolate for the Mentally Retarded, Nutley, New Jersey.

The committee at St. Margaret Mary (Apalachin) may be contacted through the CCD Office, 50 Chestnut St., Rochester, N.Y. 14604, or through Sister Esther, Mission Helpers of the Sacred Heart, 330 West Buffalo St., Ithaca, N.Y. 14850.

Father Foster Rogers, at Christ the King parish, can advise as to existing programs in the Rochester area, and there are programs under way at St. Ambrose, Endicott and Our Lady of Sorrows, Vestal.

As the time nears for setting up next year's programs in your parish do not neglect this very important phase of a complete religious education program.
