'Sing Out' Scheduled

An "evening of music" will be staged by the "Sing-Out '69" group of St. Jerome's parish, East Rochester, at 8:15 p.m. Friday, Apr. 11, at the Nazareth Arts Center.

Sponsoring the performance is the St. Martin dePorres Center, an agency serving the poor in Rochester's inner city.

Based on the theme of "love of God, country and neighbor," the "Sing-Out" performance features dialogue and choral and instrument music—rock through folk tunes. During three performances recently in the parish, the group at-

tracted an audience of 1700 persons.

Its membership comprises 80 girls and 30 boys of high school age. The music section includes four guitars, piano, drums and banjo. There also is a stage crew of 10 youngsters.

The show is produced by Father Terence X. Fleming, assistant at St. Jerome's. Mrs. Mary Connors is music director.

Rare Birds Sighted In Art Gallery

With this display are a number of photomurals made from drawings by John White, showing shore birds and decoys in outdoor settings.

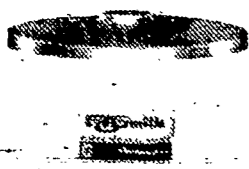

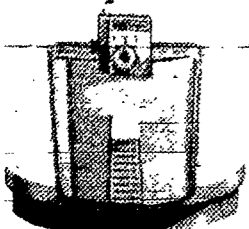
