Add A Surprise to Easter Tradition

When family and friends gather for traditional ham 'n' eggs with fresh-from-the-oven bread on Easter at noon, surprise everyone with a specially decorated cake. It's easy to do with standard mixes of your choice and this fluffy frosting recipe. Make the ham a spectacular success with one of the glazes shown here a rich, glossy mustard glaze, or an Orange or a Pineapple glaze.



Pretty as a picture Easter ham shinning with an easy corn syrup glaze. The Easter Bonnet Cake is made with a cake mix plus a simple non-cook Fluffy White Frosting.

EASTER BAKED HAM

1 ready-to-eat ham (about 13 pounds)
1 cup dark corn syrup
2 teaspoons dry mustard
Trim ham, then place, fat side up, on rack in roasting pan. Heat in 325 degree F. (slow) oven about 1 hour and 15 minutes. Remove ham from oven; score making cuts about 1/4-inch deep, about 1-inch apart across fat surface of ham. Mix corn syrup and dry mustard until well blended. Drizzle corn syrup and mustard mixture over ham. Continue baking, basting frequently, until ham is well glazed and heated thoroughly, about 45 minutes. Makes 25 generous servings. Glaze may be used for vegetables if desired.

Orange Glazed Ham: Pour about 1 cup dark corn syrup into a mixing bowl. Stir in 1 teaspoon grated orange rind and 1 1/2 teaspoons dry mustard. Use this mixture to drizzle baking directions for Easter Baked Ham.

Pineapple Glazed Ham: Pour 1 cup dark corn syrup into a mixing bowl. Stir in 1 teaspoon grated orange

rind, 1 1/2 teaspoons dry mustard and 1 (1-pound 4 ounce) can crushed pineapple. Use as glaze for ham and follow directions for Easter Baked Ham.

EASTER BONNET CAKE

1 package cake mix (for two layers)
1 recipe Fluffy White Frosting
Flowers, candies or other decorations
Prepare and bake cake according to directions on package, making 1 (8-inch) and 1

(9-inch) layer. Cool on wire rack. Lightly frost top of 9-inch layer. Set 8-inch layer on top so there is an even border of the 9-inch layer showing. Spread frosting on top border and sides of 9-inch layer. Smooth with spatula. Spread generous amount of frosting on sides and top of 8-inch layer. Swirl with spoon or spatula. Decorate as desired to create an Easter bonnet. Makes 8 servings.

FLUFFY WHITE FROSTING

2 egg whites
1/2 cup light corn syrup
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon vanilla
Combine egg whites, corn syrup, sugar and salt in double boiler top. Beat slightly with electric mixer on top speed until frothing holds stiff peaks when beater is raised, about 3 to 4 minutes. Remove from boiling water. Continue beating 1 minute. Add vanilla. Beat well. Makes enough to cover top and sides of 2 (8 or 9-inch) layers.

Dorothy Keefe Named To Anti-Poverty Post

Miss Dorothy M. Keefe of Rochester will be a field representative for the Genesee Valley area of the State Office of Economic Opportunity. Working out of the Commerce Building, 119 E. Main St. in Rochester, Miss Keefe will cover the counties of Wayne, Ontario, Livingston, Monroe, Wyoming and Genesee.

"We are indeed fortunate in having a person of Miss Keefe's attainments on our staff," Dr. Jack Sable, director of OEO, said. "She has had considerable experience teaching and working among the disadvantaged. She will be invaluable in our overall task of providing upward mobility for poverty stricken individuals."

As field representative, Miss Keefe will help local community action and non-profit agencies develop, conduct and administer anti-poverty programs in the areas of employment,

health, vocational rehabilitation, housing, home management, welfare, and any other action needed to help the poor.

Miss Keefe designed and directed the first Head Start program in Rochester and has continued as director for Project Head Start for the past five years. Before joining Action for a Better Community, Miss Keefe was principal of St. Thomas the Apostle School in Irondequoit.

A native of Rochester, Miss Keefe attended Nazareth College of Rochester before transferring to Manhattanville College of the Sacred Heart, New York City, where she received the degree of bachelor of music. She has done graduate work in guidance and counseling at Notre Dame University, South Bend, Ind., and in administration at the University of Rochester.
