Ecumenical Service Marks Good Friday

The Greece Pastors Association again demonstrated its concern for Christian unity by the sponsorship of a Good Friday

afternoon ecumenical service. Held at St. Charles Borromeo Church, it was titled "A Liturgy in Memory of the Passion and Death of Our Lord Jesus Christ." The 6-part service was made up of scriptural readings, prayers and homilies, with six priests and six ministers of the Greece neighborhood alternating as leaders and speakers in each part.

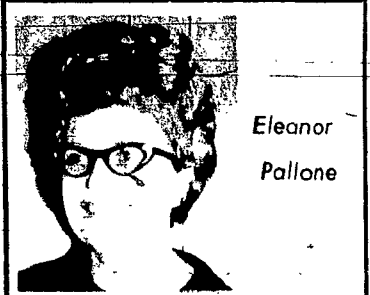

Prepare ground beef filling*
Place in mixer bowl:
1 packet RED STAR INSTANT BLEND YEAST

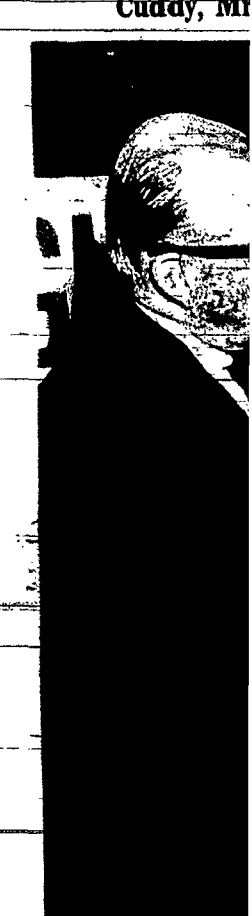
