Track No Cake-Walk at Aquinas

Like sailing and baseball, the sport of track is traditionally associated with balmy days when the turf is soft and the trees are in leafy leaf.

Not so at Aquinas Institute. For weeks, in spite of dull, gray skies, snow, rain and sleet, the Irish runners and jumpers have been flexing their muscles and showing their teeth. Now, with the advent of good weather, the Aquinas trackmen look to their first opponent of the season, powerful Franklin High, next Wednesday.

Aquinas has been singularly blessed through the years with track athletes who have distinguished themselves in city and county competition.

On almost any night of the track season on the makeshift under path behind the Basilian

residence, amid the clatter and din and incredible confusion on the campus, a slightly rounded, powerfully built priest, gathers a small group of athletes around him and repairs to his station on the southwest corner of the track. The priest is Father Don McCarthy, C.S.B., highly successful coach of the Irish track team.

Success just does not happen for him. Father McCarthy makes his men work for it. As a coach, he excels at gauging a man's potential and getting all he can out of him. His assistant coach, Father Ken McKernan, does the same thing.

As a coach, Father McCarthy is naively idealistic. His manner is deceptive. If he thinks one of his boys has been given a bad day, he can erupt with impressive violence. He feels it is his job to fight for his boys.

There seems to be little doubt that Father McCarthy's idealism, as well as his track tutoring, has left a mark on every boy who wears an Aquinas track shirt.

As one of his assistants said, "Working under Father McCarthy, I've often been reminded of the young men of the ancient Athens who took an oath to make the world a better place to live in and never do anything to disgrace themselves. We don't take oaths, of course, but it's the same idea."

Obscenity and Law Subject of Film
