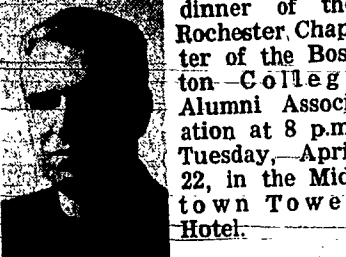


Clothed in Smiles

Boston College President to Be Alumni Speaker

The Very Rev. W. Seavey Joyce, S.J., president of Boston College, will be guest speaker at the annual dinner of the Rochester Chapter of the Boston College Alumni Association at 8 p.m. Tuesday, April 22, in the Midtown Tower Hotel.



Ordained in 1943, Father Joyce holds a master's degree in economics from Boston College and a Georgetown University and a doctor's in economics from Harvard, as well as licentiate degrees in philosophy and sacred theology from Weston College.

He served as dean of the College and Graduate School of Business Administration at Boston College.

From its inception in 1963 until last month, Father Joyce had been president of the Boston Metropolitan Area Planning Council. A state agency, the council is responsible for the physical, social and economic planning for 9 communities in the Greater Boston area with a population of nearly three million.

He also served as chairman of the Boston Citizens Advisory Committee on Community Development from its start in 1963 until May 1967.

Aquinas Institute's 1969 Fund Drive is nearing the half way point in both time and money, according to Father Leon G. Hart, C.S., Principal.

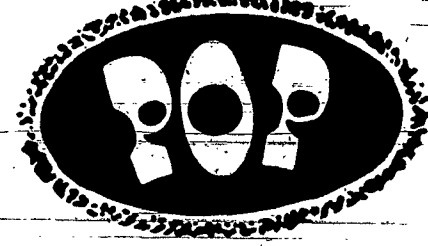

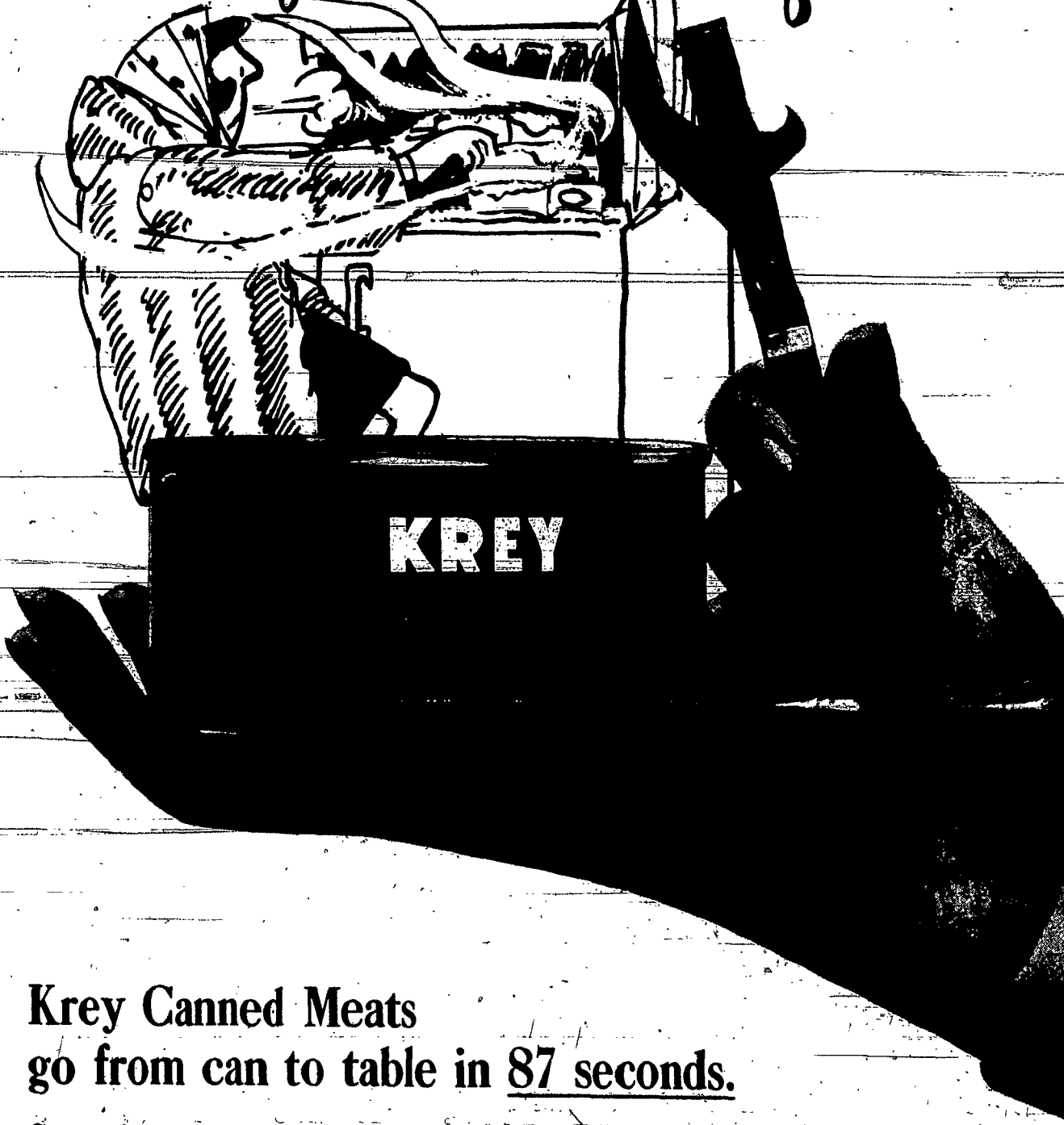

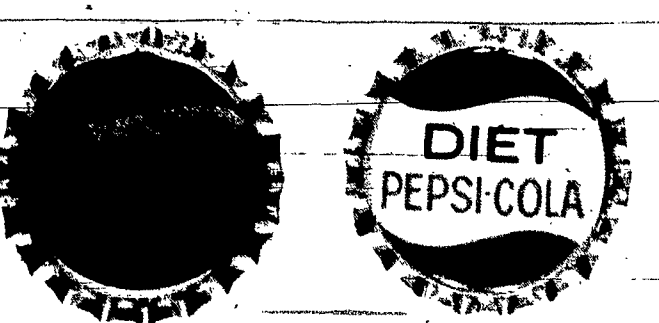
