## Students to Visit And Study Japan

Sister Rose Ellen and Miss Ann Fien of Nazareth Academy's history department will conduct a study tour of Japan this summer for area high school students.

The group will leave Oakland, Calif., July 7 for Tokyo.

From their headquarters at Olympic Memorial Youth Center there, the students will visit Yokohama, Osaka, Kobe and several other areas, while devoting four hours a day to formal study of Oriental civilization. Academic credit will be given for the course and a few openings are available, the teachers announced this week.

Eight students of St. Bernard's Seminary will serve as counselors during the six encampment periods for boys in June and July at Camp Stella Maris, diocesan camp on Conesus Lake.

Women teachers and college and high school girls are being enlisted as counselors for the three encampments for girls in August.

There are six one-week periods for boys from 7 to 15 years of age (June 22-Aug. 2) and three one-week periods for girls 8 to 14 years of age (Aug. 3-23), with option to combine periods for a longer encampment.

"Camp is for kids," remarked one of the seminarian counselors, "but we admit we enjoy being with kids, and we have fun ourselves. Camp is a wonderful place to 'live' and grow in one's awareness of his Christian responsibility. That's what the counselors see as the value of spending their time there."

Their objective, he added, "is not just to teach; rather it is to show the children an enjoyable time — learning will happen naturally. There is fun in what is done."

## Another Big One For Aquinas "9"

The Aquinas Institute baseball team is shooting for its seventh straight winning season and despite a couple of question marks, the team could well do it.

The Irish finished with a 32-9 record last year, but was better than its record indicated. The year before, Aquinas posted a fine 14-3 record and captured the Diocesan Championship.

With only a handful of returns, Coach Mike Piehler C.S.B., will have to rely on a number of juniors. Piehler is making his debut as a baseball coach. The Basilian Scholastic is assisted by Bill Leone of Becket Hall. Both are Aquinas graduates.

Heading the list of returns is senior Al Graziano, a hard-hitting first baseman. A tough competitor, he gives 100 per cent every time he takes the field.

Two of his infield mates are also veterans and are solid hitters and fielders. They are junior Bill Falandays and senior Glenn Pezzulo at second and third, respectively.

Short stop is up for grabs with sophomore Tom Rolwig and senior Mike Dossier battling for the job. Rolwig also expects to help out on the mound.

Gerry Lasponara, the team's leading hitter last season, is set as catcher. He's a line-drive hitter with good power. Roy Compertore will cover right field.

The other two outfield spots are open with Bill Murrer and Allen Benjamin having the inside track. One or two of the pitching staff may be pressed for outfield duty.

Aquinas opens the season Monday, April 28 when the Irish host Batavia High at 4 p.m.

Jim Zimmerman pitched against the Batavians and was going strong until the fifth inning, when his teammates made four errors to allow three runs.

Mike Welch had three hits, and Zimmerman doubled to help his own cause. John Myers, Glenn Fritz, and John Tettinger accounted for three of the Kings seven hits.

A busy week is ahead for the Kings as they visit Gates Monday, then are at home to Webster Thursday and East Rochester Friday.

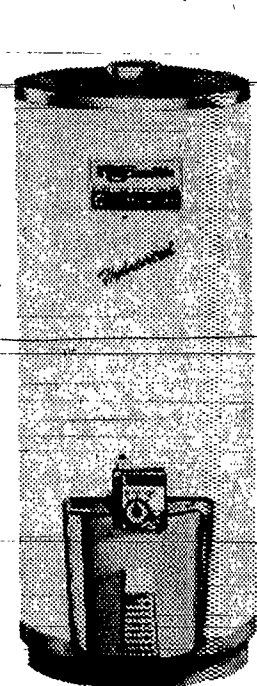
