

McQuaid Runners Star At Philadelphia Meet

Tough competition and ideal running conditions brought out the best in McQuaid's runners last Saturday at the Penn Relays, Franklin Field in Philadelphia, where the Knights turned in two of the top performances in area track history.

In the class mile relay, competing against 10 squads from four states, McQuaid's team of Mike Pignato, Alan Bredekamp, Mark Weider, and Mark Welt came home first by 5 yards in 3:26.8. The time was almost 5 seconds under the record set by a McQuaid team finishing third

in the 1965 Penn Relays and also well under the upstate New York standard of 3:30.4 set by St. Joseph's of Buffalo last year.

Pignato, a junior running on his first mile relay, led off with a 52.5 leg, bringing his team in a close third. Bredekamp, also a junior, used his long stride to turn in a 50.9 and give the Knights a 10-yard lead. Weider, a senior opened it to 15 yards with a 51.7, and Welt, a senior, closed it with a 51.7 against a fast-closing man from Pasack Valley High of New Jersey.

brought the baton home first with a 2:00.0 lead-off, senior Bob Wafer kept the Knights a close third with a 2:04.5, and they maintained that spot on a 2:04.2 by junior Dean Stanley and a 2:06.9 anchor by senior Pete Clark.

On Friday, the Knights' 440 foursome of Welt, Weider, Pignato, and Ned Roland did a 45.0 finishing third in their heat, but the time was not good enough to advance them to the championship round.

In dual meet competition last week, McQuaid suffered its first loss, 78-58, against CHS of Syracuse, downed Madison, 79-47, and was postponed against Webster. A 78-58 win over Batavia on Monday left the record at 4-1, with powerful Monroe on tap for Tuesday.

After Gates-Chili took a 3-0 lead, Kearney scored once in the second and added four more runs in the sixth to take the lead. Mike Welch singled, and John O'Rourke, in a pinch-hitting assignment, also singled to score the runs. Den Fitzpatrick, who relieved Larry Rogers in the sixth, singled home a run in the top of the seventh.

The Webster Ridgemen started the scoring in the second inning when Doug Stein tripled, and gave them a three-run lead. John O'Rourke doubled, Steve Werner and pitcher Jim Zimmerman singled, and Mike Knope tripled to score five runs for the King attack. Glenn Fritz singled home another run in the fifth. Catcher Steve Werner belted two singles.

Den Fitzpatrick reached his second victory in a grand fashion on Friday, striking out 11, and slamming a home run to single home another run in the fifth. John Ryan singled home a Kearney run in the first to start the tallying. Then 17 Kings batted in the third. Knope, John Myers, Welch, John Tettinger, Jim Zimmerman, and Werner singled. Fritz doubled and Fitzpatrick homered to score the 12 runs.
