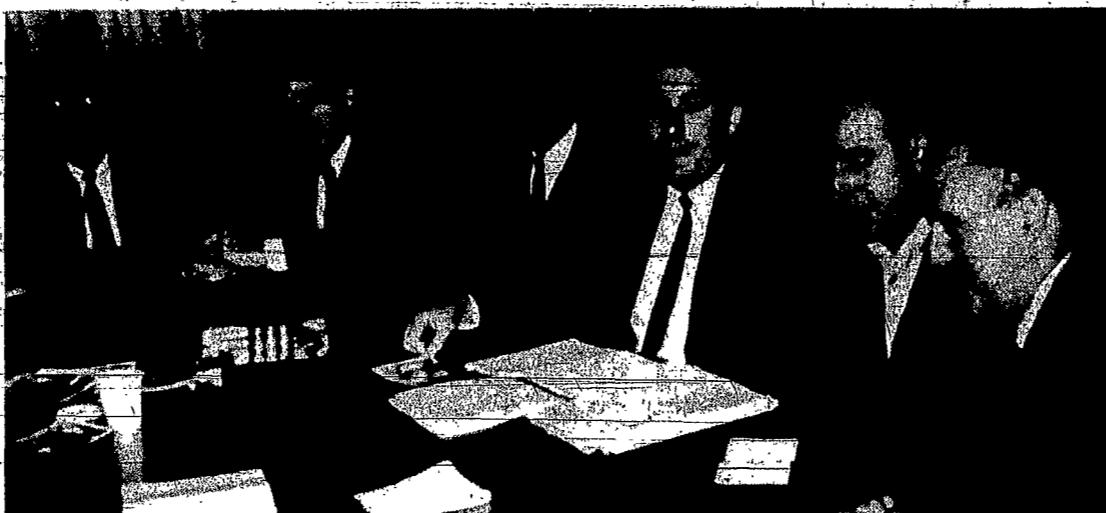

1,500 Expected At Day Camps

Nearly 1,500 youngsters from 6 to 13 years of age are expected to participate in the CYO summer day camp programs in five camps — two in Rochester, and one each in Irondequoit, Henrietta and Greece.

The camp schedule opens in late June and extends through late August. It will be the 29th season of such CYO programs.

CYO camps are staffed by professionally trained persons in recreation and physical education, along with college students and skilled teachers. The program includes swimming instructions, hiking, gym, arts and crafts, and day trips to parks and points of interest.

Registrations are being taken at the CYO Office, 50 Chestnut St. (454-2030). The camps include:

- CYO Downtown Day Camp** — June 23-Aug. 29. Bus transportation available from Sacred Heart, St. Augustine, Holy Family, Holy Apostles, St. Monica, St. Boniface, Blessed Sacrament and other parish with registered campers. Special arrangements for children whose parents are working.
- St. Martin dePorres Day Camp** — June 23-Aug. 15. Serving inner-city children in the Clinton-Joseph Avenue area. Registrations may be made at the Center, at St. Bridget's School or at the Mercy Mission Center, 483 Joseph Ave.
- Robert Green, a physical education and recreation instructor, will direct the camp.**
- St. Ambrose Day Camp** — June 23-Aug. 15.
- Thomas Kress will be camp director. A recreational instructor at Monroe Community College, he has been captain of lifeguards for the City Parks Department since 1960.**
- Good Shepherd Day Camp** — June 23-Aug. 15. Bus transportation will be available.
- Joseph Judge, a physical education instructor of the City School District, will direct the camp.**
- Our Mother of Sorrows Day Camp** — June 30-Aug. 22. Bus pickups will be made from various Greece parishes. Registrations will be received at Our Mother of Sorrows Social Center on Sunday, May 18, after morning Masses, and on Tuesday, May 27, from 7 to 8 p.m.
