

6 NEW PRIESTS FOR ROCHESTER DIOCESE

Six young men of the Rochester Diocese will receive the sacred powers of Holy Orders at 10 a.m. Sat., June 7, in Sacred Heart Cathedral.

Bishop Fulton J. Sheen will ordain them to the priesthood and will welcome them to the ranks of clergy serving the more than 450,000 souls in the 12-county diocese.

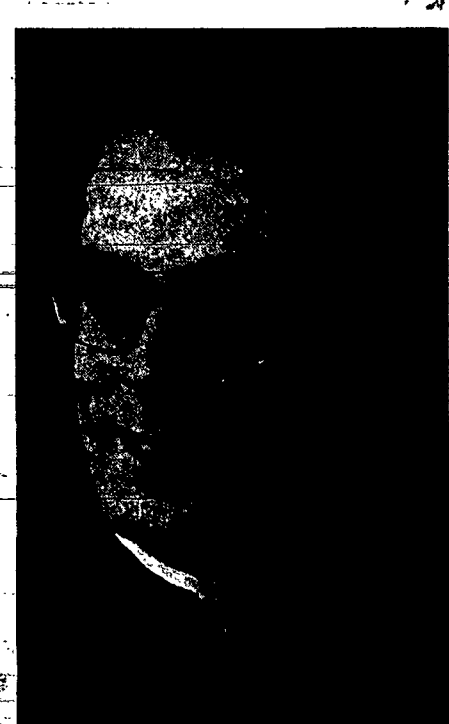

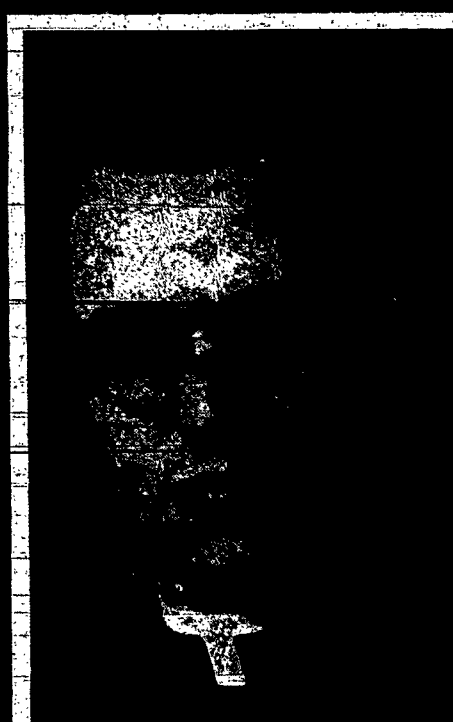

Laying on of hands is another tradition of ordination. All priests present place hands on head of newly-ordained, symbolizing the unity of the priesthood, after the Bishop has formally imposed his ordaining hands on each man.
