Confrontation CCD Asks Aid of RACL

The following letter was recently sent from the CCD Lay Advisory Board to the Rochester Association of Catholic Laymen. It highlights one of the most important tasks facing CCD—that is, defining objectives and establishing priorities in our religious education programs.

R. C. Hensler, President, RACL:

"The Lay Advisory Board of the CCD Office is interested in the further development of the Rochester Association of Catholic Laymen. We appreciate your yearning for involvement in the pressing questions of the turbulent era we are experiencing.

"Those of us involved with CCD do not pretend to be disinterested with the state of Diocesan religious education today. Questions come to mind on which the Rochester Association of Catholic Laymen may be capable of assistance, not only in publicizing your views but researching and making known the views of the laity at large.

"1. In the sphere of Diocesan finances, what are the priorities that the layman assesses as crucial? How does this layman feel Diocesan resources can best be utilized?

"2. What should the objectives of religious education be? What order of priorities does the laity hold in religious education?

"3. How widespread is the yearning for adult education and parent education, and what types of education does the laity hope for?

"4. The parochial schools question—is there a consensus among the laity regarding a course to pursue? Is the layman willing to face change to keep the Catholic school relevant to our times?
