

Interdiocesan Meet Scheduled Sunday

Rochester's four Catholic track and field squads turn their attention towards the top talent from three other dioceses this Sunday in the Second Annual Inter-Diocesan Championships at R.I.T.

Field events get under way at 1 p.m., with 40-man contingents from Albany, Syracuse, and Buffalo challenging the locals for the supremacy won by Rochester in last year's first meet.

McQuaid's diocesan champions lead the Rochester squad with 18 men, followed by Kearney with 17, and Aquinas and Mooney with 4 apiece.

There will be three defending champions in the meet, though two of them had to settle for second places in this year's diocesan meet. Neil Duffy of Aquinas, who set a mark of 49.4 in last year's Inter-Dio, was nipped by McQuaid's Al Bredekamp last week. Jim Erbolding of Kearney, a 15.8 winner in the 120-yd. high hurdles a year ago, finished second to McQuaid's Rick Stone last week.

The third defender is McQuaid's 890-yd. relay team, which barely won the right to represent Rochester by edging Aquinas in a hair-line finish last week.

McQuaid Trackmen Triumph

McQuaid Jesuit High's powerful track and field forces successfully defended its Catholic League championship last Friday at the RIT field. Bishop Kearney finished second, Aquinas third, and Cardinal Mooney last.

Rick Stone led the McQuaid victory with a meet record 20.0 in the 180-yard low hurdles and an all-time league mark 15.0 in the 120-yard high hurdles.

Mooney's 1969-70 tennis team capped their first Catholic League championship when they blanked Bishop Kearney 5-0.

The season started with three straight setbacks. After a win over McQuaid, they lost again to Pittsford. Then the team rebounded by running off eight straight victories including six shutouts.

While previous teams have had outstanding players, this year's is well-balanced, best shown by the fact there isn't a player on the team with a losing record.

This year's netmen include Tim Oakes, Dave Resch, and Kathy Van Allen at singles. The doubles consist of Tom McFee and Greg Martin; Ron McLaren and Gary Osley; Dave Johnson and Steve Hall. Heading the winning team is coach Mike DiFore.

Fitzpatrick In No-Hitter

While Fitzpatrick was striking out 15 Knights, the Kings were finding McQuaid's ace, Nick Combs, pretty difficult himself. Combs struck out 18 overall and allowed only four scattered hits. Although Fitzpatrick didn't let a runner get to third base, both pitchers had to work out of jams throughout the game. Three times anxious, McQuaid runners were picked off first; Fitzpatrick nailed two of them, and battery-mate Steve Werner the other.

Students Capped In Auburn Program

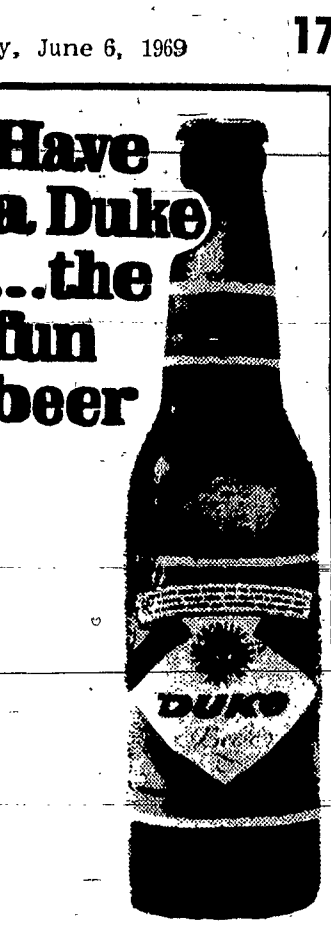
