**Chicago Priest to Speak At Fr. Finks Testimonial**

Msgr. John J. Egan, chairman of the Association of Catholic Priests, Chicago Archdiocese, and director of the diocesan Office of Urban Affairs, will be principal speaker at a testimonial dinner for Father P. David Finks, vicar for the Office for Urban Ministry of the Rochester Diocese, at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, June 17, in Immaculate Conception School hall.

Father Finks last week began a two-year assignment as assistant director for the Division of Urban Life in the Department of Social Development of the National Catholic Conference in Washington, D.C.

Bishop Fulton J. Sheen, who was requested to assign Father Finks to the Washington office, will be a guest at the testimonial dinner, as will be Bishop George W. Barrett, bishop of the Rochester Episcopal Diocese. Religious and lay friends of Father Finks, as well as community and political leaders, also will attend.

Father Finks was ordained June 9, 1956. He served as assistant pastor of St. Charles Borromeo Church, Greece, and was appointed chaplain at Our Lady of Mercy High School in 1960. He was named assistant pastor of Immaculate Conception Church, Rochester, in 1965.

**Needed: Friends To Turn Their Better Houses Into Real Homes**

Seven Rochester families have been moved from the slums into better homes, through the Bishop Sheen Housing Foundation since March. What they need now is friends.

Mrs. Jerome C. Cook asked this week for volunteers to help the families adjust to their new responsibilities.

An improved environment poses new problems, she said, on families "who have lived in real poverty and neglect for many years."

She mentioned these areas where counsel is needed: budgeting the income and shopping economically for food and clothing; in the upkeep, insurance and protection of property; in finding out and using available medical and child care assistance.

"We feel certain that there are dedicated Christians in our Rochester community who are ready and willing to help" on a person-to-person basis, Mrs. Cook said.

The foundation, which has made a down payment on each of the seven houses, also is "in dire need of funds to carry on its work in this most critical period," Mrs. Cook continued.

"We are particularly interested in securing living quarters for families who have five or more children, because rental property for these families is practically non-existent."

A family moved by the foundation carries its own mortgage and is responsible for all expenses beyond the initial payments, she explained.

The Catholic Family Center will coordinate the person-to-person program. Volunteers may contact Mrs. Cook at 244-2078.

Bishop Sheen proposed the housing foundation two years ago in a sermon at Immaculate Conception Church. He suggested a "1024-70 Club"—\$10 a week for 24 months from 70 contributors—"the number of disciples of Christ."

The foundation was incorporated last July. The Bishop's purpose, he has said, is "to help the 'helpless' and 'to give some of the poor a measure of hopeful independence.'"
