

# Buffalo Takes Diocesan Track Win

Twelve records fell and so did Rochester, in the Second Annual Inter-Diocesan Track and Field Championships Sunday at R.I.T.

With 27 schools and 4 dioceses competing, the meet produced as good a set of performances as this area has seen on the scholastic level. When the smoke cleared from an 880 relay that saw both McQuaid and Christian Brothers of Syracuse go under that 1:30 mark with CBA winning in 1:29.1, the final score stood: Buffalo 69, Rochester 67, Albany 63, Syracuse 27.

Albany led in first places with 6 records; Buffalo had four firsts, all of them records; Rochester had four firsts and two records; and Syracuse, the spoiler as it turned out, had two firsts and two records.

Sophomore Don Brown accounted for both of the latter, really. He handled one all by himself with an unprecedented 21.4 for the 220. The other came on his blazing anchor leg; just a tenth off the record.

The meet's only double winners were from the Albany area. C.B.A.'s Brian Clemente set new marks in the discus (155-11) and shot (53-5 1/2), and Mike Holland of Catholic Central, Troy, took both hurdles races, the highs in a record 14.9, the lows in 19.8, just a tenth off the record.

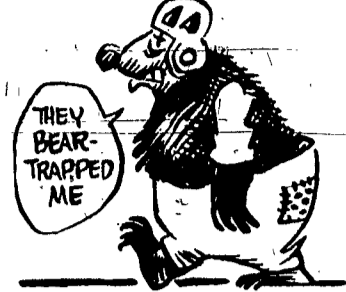
Buffalo's other winners were Bill Byron with a record 13-foot pole vault and Tom Bacher of Central Catholic with a 44 1/2 triple jump.

Buffalo's winners were miler Gerry Klas (4:27.2), two-miler Mark Cudek (9:46.8) long-jumper Pat Berrigan (22-10 1/2), and high jumper Ed Koral (6-0).

John Paul Uriah will join Aquinas Institute in September as head basketball coach and assistant football coach, according to Father Cyril F. Carter, C.S.B., athletic director.

Uriah, a native of Bridgeville, Pa., is currently a varsity basketball coach and football line coach at Bishop McCort High School in Johnstown, Pa.

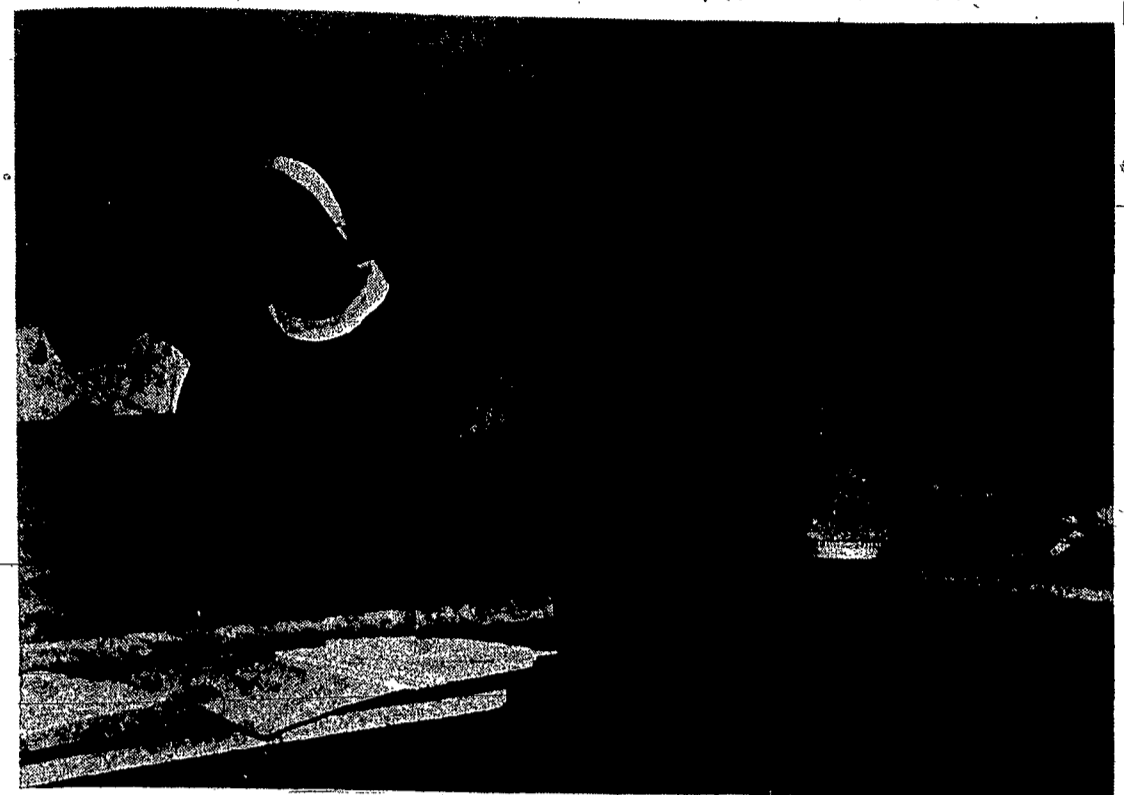
A graduate of Lincoln High School in Bridgeville where he lettered in football and basketball, Uriah is a 1961 graduate of the University of Dayton and has done graduate work at the University of Pittsburgh.

At Bishop McCort, Uriah had an overall basketball record of 53 wins against 18 losses. In 1968 his team won the Diocesan Championship. Last season his team had a 20 and 4 record.

Uriah, who will teach physical education in addition to his coaching duties, succeeds Jerry McGuire who remains as chairman of the school's Business Department.

Uriah said he was "delighted to join the Aquinas faculty" and make his home in the Rochester area. "Aquinas represents the type of school with academic standing which I have been connected with and it will give me the opportunity to fulfill a desire to participate in a fine sports program," he said.

### The Value of Workshops

The CCD-sponsored workshop on the Benziger "Word and Worship" series last week at Sacred Heart Cathedral was the first of several such programs scheduled this spring and summer through the efforts of the CCD Office and various publishing companies.

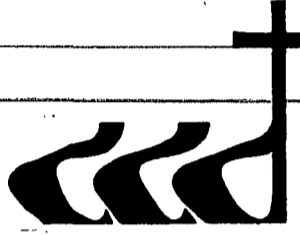
In the planning stages at this time are workshops on the Sadlier series, one of the more widely used elementary series in the diocese, and a workshop on Argus publications. The Argus "Choose Life" series is one of the best high school level series available.

The Paulist Press, publishers of the "Come to the Father" series, has scheduled "A CCD Come-to-the-Father Teach In" Saturday and Sunday, June 28 and 29 at Becket Hall, St. John Fisher College. The teach-in, conducted by

Father Kevin Lynch, editor-in-chief of Paulist Press, is aimed at CCD teachers and administrators, priests religious, and lay people.

Reservations are due by June 16 and are to be mailed to: Come-to-the-Father CCD Teach In, 50 Chestnut St., Rochester, N.Y. 14604. Registration fee for lectures and meals is \$12, payable by check at the time of registration. For those desiring overnight lodging there is an additional \$2 fee. Checks are to be made payable to the Diocese of Rochester.

The Teach In sessions will begin at 10 a.m. Saturday and the program will cover all phases of the "Come to the Father" series from the preschool program through the elementary grades. A general introduction and orientation to a complete program gives it an approach which is especially important in this



particular series which is geared to a total parish program for participation of parents, priest, and teacher. At this teaching teachers are given the catechetical background as well as the necessary applications to accomplish the program's purposes.

This year's CCD parish survey indicated that there are about 30 parishes using the Paulist Press series for at least a part of their elementary grade program.

There are also many parishes who are using this series in their preschool programs. If you are in the process of establishing a preschool program, this is the "best program" for this age level.

The textbook series used in any particular Christian education program is the nucleus around which the rest of the course is formed. Most educators will tell you that the textbook is the least important of factors.

This is true in the sense that a book alone does not communicate the message of Christ to students. A good text, however, is not simply a book to be read, but is a part of a total program. Whatever series you use in your religious education program, take full advantage of opportunities to learn to use your material in the most effective way possible.
