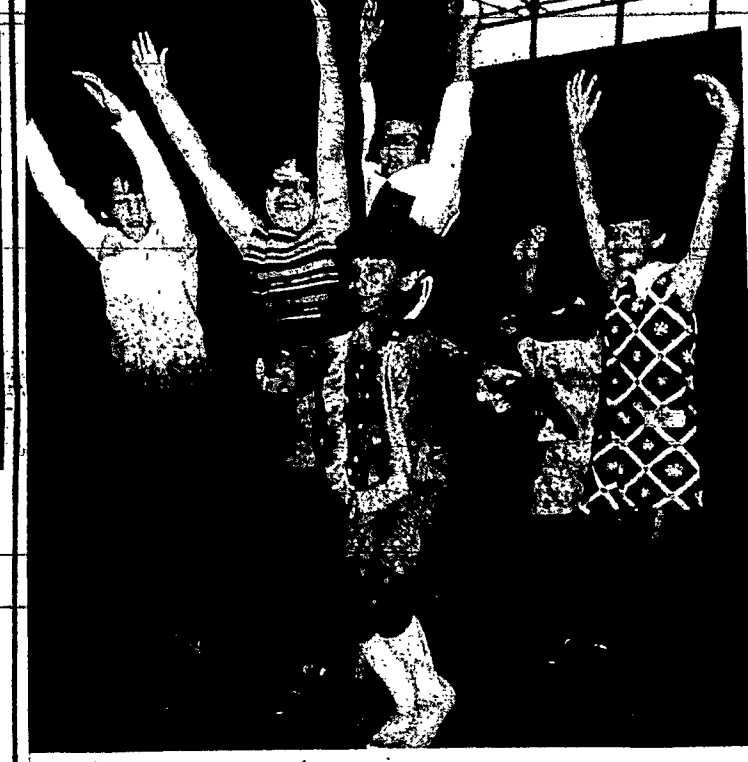
Dear Lucille,

Summer Playhouse Sets 2 Productions

An unusual summer program for children between the ages of 10 and 17 is well into its

fifth season at St. Agnes High School—the Storytellers' Summer Playhouse, directed by Sister Claudia Hogan. It has a cast and crew of more than 100 boys and girls from 26 different schools, public and parochial, in the Rochester area.

More than 300 students tried out for the Playhouse this year and those selected are now working daily on this summer's productions, "Alice in Wonderland" to be presented July 10 and 11, and "Babes in Toyland" for July 24 and 25.

Each day begins with formal classes in choral work, dancing and dramatics; gradually, as each young performer learns his own part, the actual production evolves.

A large staff of adults works with the Summer Playhouse, and they, in turn, are assisted by students who sign up specifically for scenery, costumes, stage assistance, etc.

The orchestra will be composed of adults who have worked with Sister Claudia in her productions over several years. Tickets for the four evening performances are \$1 for general admission and \$1.50 for reserved seats; they are available at the St. Agnes box office, 300 East River Road, or by phone, 442-6780.
