## Confrontation

### Supplementary Series

In addition to the several text book series considered in this column in past weeks, other series may be used to supplement them.

The Life, Love and Joy series is published by Silver Burdett and was prepared under the auspices of the National Center, Confraternity of Christian Doctrine. The series includes a student's text, teacher's manual, and separate parents' guide.

The child's book is illustrated with excellent photography and some children's art and abstract art work. The text is kept to a minimum in these primary grade texts, and is scriptural whenever possible.

The scripture selections are well chosen and are suited to the child's grade level. At the end of each section is a picture review and space for

the child to draw, paste, or write in the book itself.

The teacher's manual included a very thorough background section for each lesson, and a fairly detailed lesson plan.

Included in the teacher's manual are short musical selections and good list of recommended readings for the teacher. The parents' booklet is adaptable for parent-teacher meetings, or may be used by the parents individually.

The title of this series is a clue to its approach. The authors first try to help the child become aware of the meaning of life—on all its many levels and then to see that life as a loving response to God.

The lessons have a three pronged approach—first to explore with the child some aspect of his own life, then to relate the child's experience to Christ's life, and finally to help the child understand the interrelation of the two.

Next week we will discuss the Christian Inheritance series.
