Bazaar to Aid Missions in Africa, Brazil

Two Rochester priests — one serving in Africa, the other in South America — will benefit from proceeds of a "backyard bazaar" beginning at 6 p.m. Friday, Aug. 15, at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Ronald F. Bennett, 67 Wetmore St.

Proceeds will be divided between Father Charles G. Erb, SVD, serving in Ghana, Africa, and Father John J. Drexel, serving in Sao Paulo, Brazil. Families of both priests are parishioners of Holy Family Church.

It will be the fifth annual such bazaar to aid the priests' mission work. The first one four years ago was begun by the Bennett children, and netted \$30. Last year's proceeds totaled \$600.

Father Erb, in Rochester visiting relatives, will attend the bazaar and will display photos of his work in Ghana.

Needed: Foster Homes for Adults

If you have extra space in your home and are interested in adding to your income, you might consider operating a foster home for adults.

There is a critical need for such homes in Monroe County, particularly for persons over 65, according to Dr. Donald K. Stockdale, deputy county health director and medical consultant for the county Department of Social Services.

Officially, these homes are designated "Family-Type Proprietary Homes for Adults." They serve between 2 and 5 persons, and they provide board and room and personal assistance.

The Monroe County Department of Social Service pays \$5.50 per day for the care of each person.

Dr. Stockdale said there is a heavy demand for family-type homes for adults here because of the high population of persons over 65.

"Because we have only three such homes in our community," he continued, "many older persons, including recipients of public welfare, are forced into higher-cost facilities, such as nursing homes. This intensifies the shortage of nursing home beds and adds to the costs of taxes and medical care."

Dr. Stockdale explained that "many older persons are widows who are no longer able to live alone. They don't require nursing or medical care. They just need to be looked after. They simply require room and board and some personal assistance."
