### Pupil Enrollment Declines in Auburn

Auburn—A total of 423 fewer children in eight Auburn parishes are enrolled in parochial schools this semester than last year. A total of 1,974 pupils are in seven parochial elementary schools; 2,417 were enrolled in eight schools last term. Major reason for the decrease was the June closing of St. Francis of Assisi—School because Sister-teachers could not be obtained. Enrollment is down also in Mt. Carmel High School, from 764 last year to 700 this semester. Current statistics reveal that girls far outnumber boys. The figures: girls, 406; boys, 294.

### Fr. Moran Leaving Retreat House Post

Canandaigua — Father Richard Moran, CSSR, director of Notre Dame Retreat House here, has been assigned to parish work at Our Lady of Lourdes Church, Baltimore. Father Daniel Carboy has been transferred from the Baltimore parish to be a retreat master at Notre Dame House. Father Moran, who came to the Rochester Diocese in 1965, has "lived with 11,200 men" on 181 weekend and midweek retreats. During the last three years he also helped arrange 35 three-day seminars — described as "an experience in Christian living" at the Canandaigua Lake house for nearly 2,000 teenagers. Father Moran also conducted retreats for married and engaged couples, ecumenical groups, and businessmen's, family, single, college and high school groups.

### Rochester Nun In Teaching Study

A Rochester nun — Sister Mary Cyril Smelt, SSJ — is a member of a group which has been studying ways to devise better education approaches to the teaching of minority cultures in parochial schools. Titled the Minority Culture Group, the committee is a subdivision of the Catholic Curriculum Commission, set up recently to serve schools in 11 dioceses. It has met in Rochester, Buffalo and Latham. Results of the committee's work will be published soon under the title of "Minority Cultures — Resource and Activity Handbook for Teachers." The group also produced a book of "Brotherhood — Bulletin Board" ideas which will be issued by a national publishing firm.

Returning to St. Bernard's are Deacons Peter T. Barry, who has been serving as an assistant Army chaplain at Fort Knox, Ky.; Donald Curtis, serving at Our Lady of Mercy Church; Frederick Helfrich, assisting at St. Monica's Church, and Robert Hoffman, serving at St. Michael's in Penn. Yan.

Deacon Wischmeyer, who has completed his studies for ordination, is engaged in inner city youth work. He is working with youth groups from four parishes—Sacred Heart, Holy Rosary, Holy Apostles and St. Anthony's — and from six other churches in the area.

Among other activities, he is engaged in an attempt to establish an AYM evening tutoring center for high school "drop-outs" and other non-achievers needing help. Funding assistance is being sought from area churches and business.
