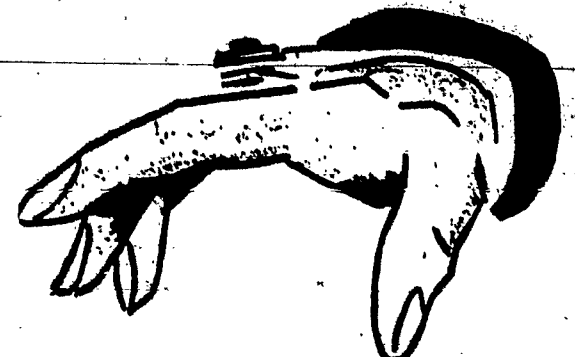

## Confrontation CCD Retreats

Although the Notre Dame Retreat House in Canandaigua is known primarily for its weekend retreats for men, a variety of programs are offered there; and one of the most important is "Teen Seminar."

These three-day, co-ed experiences in Christian living are a far cry from the two extremes—in retreats that many of us remember from high school and college—the ones that were so unimaginative and unstructured that they were an excuse to do nothing but play for a few days and those that were so strict and unrelenting that one felt the most overpowering urge to sleep.

The teen seminars, which run from Monday evening to Wednesday afternoon, aim to involve the 40 participants in all aspects of Christian family life—work, play, and prayer. Using the basic theme of "The Love of Christ Urges Us

On" the program explores the meaning and implications of Christianity and Christian love and commitment involved in family situations, in jobs, on dates, in world and social problems.

The general atmosphere is one of freedom, humor, respect, and honesty. Activities are designed to encourage communication within the family of participants though there are periods of silence such as before mass and after meditations, and the "grand" (or absolute) silence is observed at night, the main emphasis is on sharing the total experience rather than isolating oneself from the influence of others.

The staff includes a priest and four young adults, two men and two young women, or married couples who have experienced a weekend seminar themselves. These people take care of the physical aspects of the program such as planning parties and work projects, as well as acting as

older brothers and sisters to the participants, stimulating discussions and in general establishing a spirit of friendliness, openness, and atmosphere.

Open to Catholic and public school teens the seminars are normally geared to Juniors and Seniors in High School. There are also special programs for young adults and college students.

The schedule for the remainder of this year is: Nov. 17-18; Nov. 24-25, Dec. 1-2, Dec. 8-10, and Dec. 15-17. With the start of the new year seminars will probably be scheduled for each Monday through Wednesday. Participants are asked to contact the retreat house at least one week in advance. Other activities scheduled by the Retreat House include days of recollection for eighth graders.
