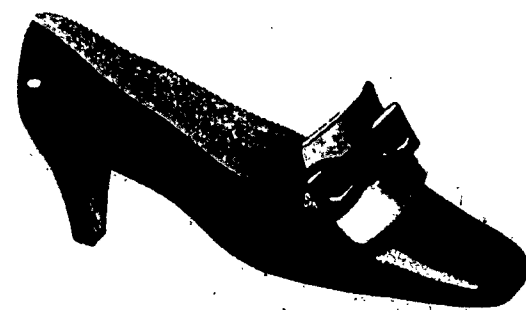

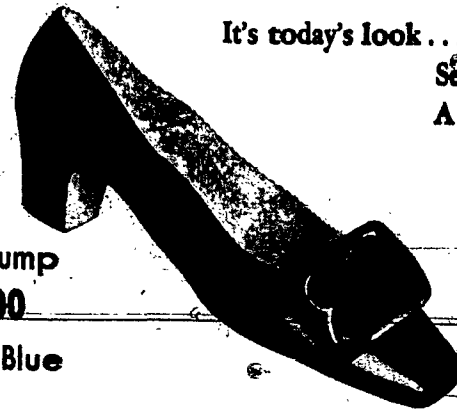

Apostolic Delegate ... What He Does

Washington—Extensive communication by mail, plus many miles of travel for visits throughout the country, is a simplified explanation of the duties of the Apostolic Delegate to the United States.

Archbishop Luigi Raimondi, currently Pope Paul VI's personal representative in this country, will travel to Rochester to ordain Bishop-designate Joseph L. Hogan as seventh Bishop of Rochester on Friday, Nov. 28.

His last visit to Rochester was in March, 1967, for the ordination of Auxiliary Bishops Dennis W. Hickey and John E. McCafferty.

Archbishop Raimondi was well trained as "a man on the move" prior to his appointment to Washington on June 30, 1967. He has been in the diplomatic service of the Holy See since 1938, serving in Guatemala, India, Haiti and Mexico.

Born in Italy Oct. 25, 1912, he was ordained to the priesthood June 6, 1936. Ordained a bishop in 1954, he is titular archbishop of Tarsus, and holds doctorates in theology and canon law.

The soft-spoken prelate, whose personal strength and sense of dignity seem often belied by a ready smile, acknowledges long hours at his desk in the large and solid building on Massachusetts Avenue's "embassy row" in the capital.

It is here that he lives, along with a half-dozen priests who assist him. Most priests at the delegation are in the regular services of the Holy See and are transferred from country to country as needs change.

"These priests are chosen and trained in ways quite similar to the diplomatic service of nations," Archbishop Raimondi explains, "but they are not to be equated with diplomats because their mission is completely different."

"There is some contact with governments, and this at times is along diplomatic lines. But the content is always religious in nature."

"The Delegate is a man representing the Church, representing the Holy See as a spiritual institution."

"The Apostolic Delegation is recognized as an official agency similar in certain respects to the International Red Cross or the Organization of American States. In a strictly legal sense it does not have extraterritorial status, but in a practical sense it does have a certain special status."

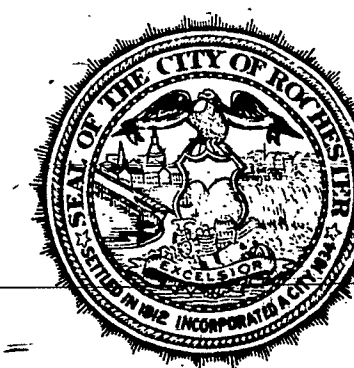
"The office of the Apostolic Delegate has a great deal of correspondence with bishops and organizations, with Catholics and non-Catholics."

"There is extensive communication with the congregations, the hierarchy, the conference of bishops, the conference of Religious, and others."
