Officers of Mass and Ordination of Bishop Hogan

Ordination of Bishop-designate Hogan as seventh Bishop of Rochester and his installation in that office occur during the Mass of Ordination.

The Mass begins as usual, proceeding through the opening prayers to the Epistle, which will be read by a layman, and the Gospel, to be read by a deacon from St. Bernard's Seminary. The Mass is then halted for the ordination and installation rites.

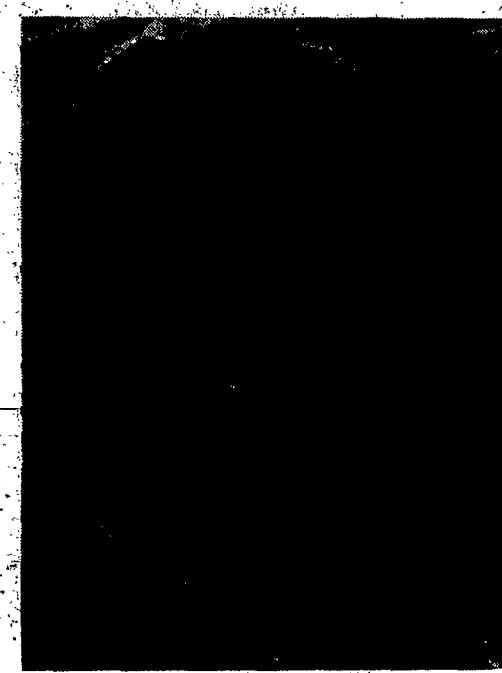
The Consecrator flanked by his Co-Consecrators seats himself at the high altar, facing the congregation, and the Bishop-designate sits facing the Consecrators. Here he answers a series of questions put to him by the Apostolic Delegate.

Following this he prostrates himself on the floor during the Litany of the Saints, then kneels before the Consecrators for the actual moment of ordination.

This occurs when the Consecrator recites the Consecration Prayer and imposes his hands upon the head of the Bishop-designate. Co-Consecrators do likewise, followed by all Bishops present.

Next he is anointed on the head and presented with the bishop's ring, mitre and crozier. He then will be led to the Episcopal Throne, symbol of his authority. This represents his "installation" as Bishop of Rochester.

After the installation, 14 representatives of groups of people in the Diocese—clergy, religious, families and youth

—come to the throne to pay respects to him in the name of all the faithful.

The Mass is continued, with concelebrants to include Terence Cardinal Cooke of New York and other Bishops, plus 12 Rochester diocesan priests, all grouped around the altar with Bishop Hogan.

Just after Communion, Bishop Hogan will walk down the middle aisle, greeting his family and conferring his first blessing on the people. He then will go to the pulpit for his sermon.

The Mass is ended, and the recessional follows.

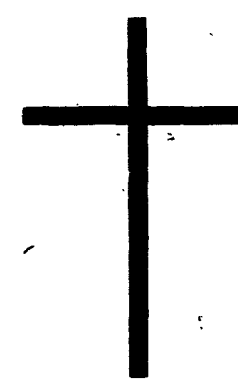
