Kings Scare Quakers Before Losing, 47-37

Bishop Kearney's Kings almost pulled out the big one against the top-rated Franklin Quakers last Friday night on the Kearney home court. The Kings were ahead before the final four minutes. Then the Quakers proved why they're number 1, showing their quickness in turning Kearney miscues into a 47-37 victory.

On Saturday night, the Kings outlasted the Jurists of Marshall 77-56 at the Marshall gym.

The Kings managed to contain Franklin, the biggest team around, in the shooting department, but the Quakers' rebounding paid off.

Mike Goonan led Kearney with 15 points, while Larry Rogers had seven. Franklin's 6-foot-7 Monroe "Pop" McTaw

was held to 13 points. Guard Felton Gray scored 16.

On the following night, Jim Erbland was Kearney's hero as the tall junior scored 23 points. John Maurer netted 20, and Mike Goonan 16. John Merriweather and Robbie Murphy hit for 20 and 19 points for the Jurists.

Goonan pulled down 19 rebounds to lead both teams.

Kearney moved to a 1-2 City-Catholic record and 2-2 overall.

Tonight (Friday), the Kings go to McQuaid to play the tough Black Knights. On Tuesday, Dec. 23, the Kings will host Notre Dame of Batavia, and on Saturday, Jan. 3, the Kings will travel to Batavia to return the visit. The McQuaid game and Batavia game start at 8:45 p.m. while the game at Batavia begins at 8 p.m.

Aquinas Wins Two

Aquinas Institute's basketball team will be shooting for its third win of the season tonight (Friday) on the Cardinal Mooney High School hardwood when the Irish meet the unbeaten Cardinals at 8:15 p.m.

The Irish notched two victories last weekend by subduing Edison Tech, 51-38, on Friday evening and then nipping Charlotte, 69-45, on Saturday.

In the Edison game Tom Rolwing sparked the attack, sinking a game-high 18 points on the R.I.T. court. Another junior, Tom Heil, chipped in with 10 points. Edison's high man with 12 points was Bob Ashford.

Aquinas had little trouble fashioning a victory over Charlotte on the Lakeside court. The Irish had their offense rolling in high gear when the pattern of the game was set in the

first period. Aquinas zoomed into a 23-10 lead and from this point it was just a matter of how much they would score. Score at halftime was 41-18.

The Maroon and White quintet shot a torrid 64 per cent from the field and 70 per cent from the free throw line. John Duignan and Brady Speitz had 18 points and the latter blinking the lights 16 times. Larry Mitchell connected on four field goals and two free throws to chip in 10 points. Tom Cayis was top man for Charlotte with 16 points.

Things will not be as easy for the Irish in tonight's game. The Cardinal's, defending Diocesan champs, have a three-way scoring punch in Ken Wehner, Dick Poinan and Jim Volkmar.

A junior varsity preliminary is set for 7 p.m.

Mooney Loses 1st

In play that had the fans on the edges of their seats last week, Cardinal Mooney lost its first game of the season, 52-50, to Madison.

The Cardinals led 13-10 after one quarter and 27-21 at halftime but the lead diminished during the third quarter until Madison took the lead. With two seconds left in the period, Mooney's Mike Green scored to make it 39-all going into the fourth quarter.

Madison's Larry Gillenwater made two free throws late in the game to seal the victory. Gillenwater ended up with 22 points while Mooney's Ken Wehner had 17 points and Green 16.

Coach Ed Metzger's Cardinals bounced back to defeat Jefferson, 58-24, the next night. Wehner again scored 17 points and did a strong job of rebounding.

Knights Split Pair

McQuaid had to settle for a split in its pair of games against City-Catholic foes last weekend when a tough West High squad outdueled the Knights, 58-46, to offset the previous night's victory over Monroe.

This Friday, McQuaid will be host to Kearney in a combined C-C and Catholic League affair. The Kings and Knights both stand at 2-2.

McQuaid's loss to West marked the third straight year that the Knights have bowed to Bob Grim's squad. The Knights led briefly at 3-2 but had to play catch-up for almost three periods, trailing 20-13, 29-23, and 38-36 at the quarter breaks.

In the fourth quarter Ned Miller's one-hander tied it for McQuaid, and Miller fed John McLane for a jump shot that put the Knights ahead, 40-38. Wally Hinton tied it for West, but McQuaid went ahead again on Ray O'Neill's foul shot and held the lead, 44-42, when Tom Combs popped in a jumper with 4:50 to play.

Hinton turned the game around then, tying the score

with a rebound shot and putting West ahead to stay with two fouls. A full-court, pass-lay-up by Charlie Gross and two free throws by McDaniel put the Knights in a 50-44 hole with 1:45 left, and West played a control game the rest of the way.

McDaniel had 14 points for scoring honors, followed by Hinton and John Harris with 13. McQuaid's trio in double figures was Combs (12), McLane (10), and Mike Ryan (10).

Against Monroe, McQuaid had the lead and the Red Jackets did the chasing. From an early 11-11 tie, the Knights broke away behind the one-handers of Ryan to lead, 23-12. Monroe came back to within 44-39 with 7:15 to play, but Combs hit a rebound shot, fed McLane for a layup, and clicked on a jumper to lock the game up, 50-39. A late spurge upped the final margin to 58-42, with Combs (15), Ryan (10), O'Neill (10), and McLane (11) all in double figures. Combs, in his best all-around showing to date, also had 13 rebounds and six assists.

Gears, who helped establish the school's 200 medley relay record in 1962 while a senior at Aquinas, succeeds Father Robert Chauvin as head swimming coach. Father Chauvin was transferred in September to Windsor, Ont., where he heads up the guidance services of Assumption High School.

Though many outstanding finners were graduated, the new coach has come up with a star-studded cast for the current campaign headed by Chip Zimmerman, a senior who has seen action for three seasons, and the "frosch phenom", Mike West.

When speaking of West, Gears immediately begins to smile. "He is one of the best freshman swimmers Aquinas has seen," Gears explained. West set a new school record in the 100-yard freestyle last week swimming against Geneva High School.
