**Mooney Beats Irish In Thriller, 41-37**

Cardinal Mooney chalked up win No. 13 last week by defeating Aquinas, 41-37, in a thriller.  
Aquinas, playing heads-up basketball, led after three periods, 31-28, but the Cardinals, paced by Pete Maher, turned the game around in the final period.  
Maher scored seven of his 12 points in the fourth quarter to provide the key to Mooney's victory.  
The game was a cliff-hanger right down to the wire. Mooney led by one point with 30 seconds to play when the Cardinal's Ker Wehner made a foul shot. Seconds later Aquinas missed a outside shot that would have tied the score and Mooney's Dick Poinan captured the rebound. He passed to Jim Vokman who scored at the buzzer.  
John Quigman led Aquinas with 16 points.

**McQuaid Tops Kings**

**NBA Chief To Speak at Cage Fete**  
J. Walter Kennedy, commissioner of the National Basketball Association, will be the featured speaker at a dinner on the eve of the fourth annual Lincoln Rochester Collegiate Basketball Tournament.  
The dinner at Oak Hill Country Club on Wednesday, Jan. 29, will honor players, coaches, and academic officials of the four participants, St. John Fisher, defending champion Brockport State, Roberts Wesleyan, and Rochester Institute of Technology.  
The tourney, sponsored by the Lincoln Rochester Trust Co., is scheduled Thursday and Saturday, Jan. 29 and 31, at the War Memorial.  
Kennedy has played a prominent role in the growth of the NBA, joining the league in 1948 as publicity director.  
He also has been sports information director at the University of Notre Dame, his alma mater; public relations consultant and international representative for the Harlem Globetrotters; mayor of Stamford, Conn., and campaign manager for Abraham Ribicoff, U.S. senator from Connecticut.

**RIT Student Captures Film Award**  
Christmas came early for young Raymond P. Villard and his avocation — taking motion pictures.  
His imagined documentary, "Visit to a Red Planet," won the "Cine Golden Eagle Certificate" from the Council on International Nontheatrical Events at its annual awards presentation in Washington, D.C. It now is being submitted into international competition.  
Villard, 19, is a second-year professional photography student at Rochester Institute of Technology's School of Photographic Arts and Sciences. He lives at 85 Brooks Ave. in Rochester and was graduated from McQuaid Jesuit High School.  
An acknowledge "space buff since I was a kid," Villard explored existing technology to base his "Visits to a Red Planet" on a visionary landing on Mars and "what might go on there." The year he projected is 1988.  
Actually, Villard completed the film as a senior project while at McQuaid — before man's real space voyage to the Moon. He also completed a shorter film, "Cam-0010," concerning a science-fiction robot, which won Eastman Kodak Co.'s 1969 Teen-Age Award in November.
