## Aquinas Taps Drive Chairman

Aquinas Institute has selected two alumni to serve as co-chairmen of its Annual Giving Program, according to Father Leon G. Hart, C.S.B., principal. They are Thomas Riley and Jack Palvino.

Riley, a 1956 graduate of Aquinas, is director of Industrial Relations for Rochester Telephone. He received his Bachelor's Degree from Princeton in 1960 and Masters from

Cornell in 1962. Riley, his wife Mary Ann and their four children are members of Sacred Heart Parish.

Palvino is a 1951 graduate of Aquinas. He is program manager and early morning personality at WBIF Radio. He is also president of Sports & Specials Television, Inc. He graduated from St. John Fisher College in 1955 and attended Buffalo Law School. Palvino, his wife Joyce and their three children belong to Mother of Sorrows Parish.

Father Hart explained that the campaign goal is \$75,000. The funds will be used to help offset the difference between operating expenses and tuition. He pointed out that in the past decade, operating expenses have risen from \$257,808 in 1959 to \$880,406 in 1969. Tuition has risen from \$236,208 in 1959 to \$444,950 in 1969. The rate was \$200 in 1959, \$450 in 1969.

Other participating consultants include Franklin Kamp of Kings Preparatory and Arthur Herd, principal of Hilton Senior High School.

## From the Office of Human Concern

**Memo To: Very Rev. John Hayes, Rector — Sacred Heart Cathedral:**

I was most impressed with the Northwest Sector Covenant signing ceremony at the Cathedral. Bishop Hogan very well expressed the need for a combined effort on the part of all denominations in meeting the sociological problems of our day. This covenant should be means of a strong realistic approach in fulfilling the aspirations that he outlined.

**Memo To: House of Concern — Lyons, N.Y.:**

Our backup supply of canned goods in the depot has been somewhat depleted. I was pleased to see so many from Wayne County coming to the depot to pick up these canned goods at their necessary items. They indicated the heavy demands being made upon the food supply in that county because of the severe winter. We

will encourage our people to renew their efforts in supplying the depot with these much needed items.

**Memo To: Council of Social Agencies:**

It was good to be at your meeting last week to see that so many local groups are struggling to meet the problems of the needy. However, I was most impressed that they realize their approach is but a stop-gap in resolving the major problems of the disadvantaged.

**Memo To: Genesee Region Health Planning Council:**

Your meeting last week was most productive. The consultant meetings scheduled for this month should establish a good base to set up a coordinated effort in meeting the health problems, both rural and urban. I was most interested in Rev. Ross' remarks in which he indicated that so often we treat only the symptoms and not the causes of poverty. This has been the consistent complaint in Wayne County. Our work has indicated that we treat patients only to send them back into the same living conditions that contributed to their health problems.

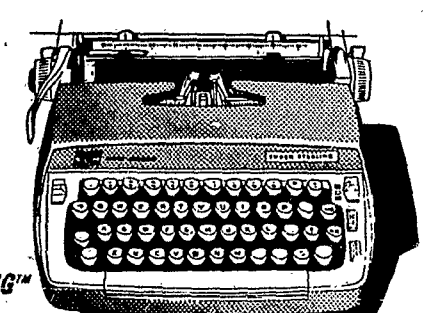

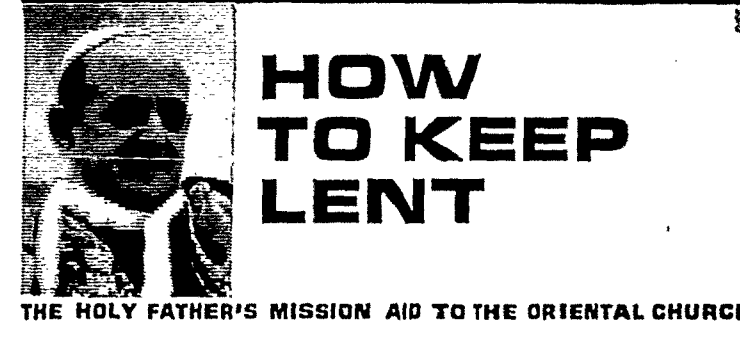
