'100' for Nietopski As Mooney Wins

The 99th and 100th career wins were gained for Coach Ed Nietopski last weekend as the Mooney basketball team took care of rival Bishop Kearney, 54-41 and then downed East, the only team to defeat the Cardinals last year, 43-29 on Saturday night.

Against Kearney, the Cards played a rough game in which the teams had a combined total of 44 fouls.

Mike Green was high scorer with 19 and the first quarter scoring surge by Peter Mahar with 10 and Dick Poinan, 15, allowed the Cards to win.

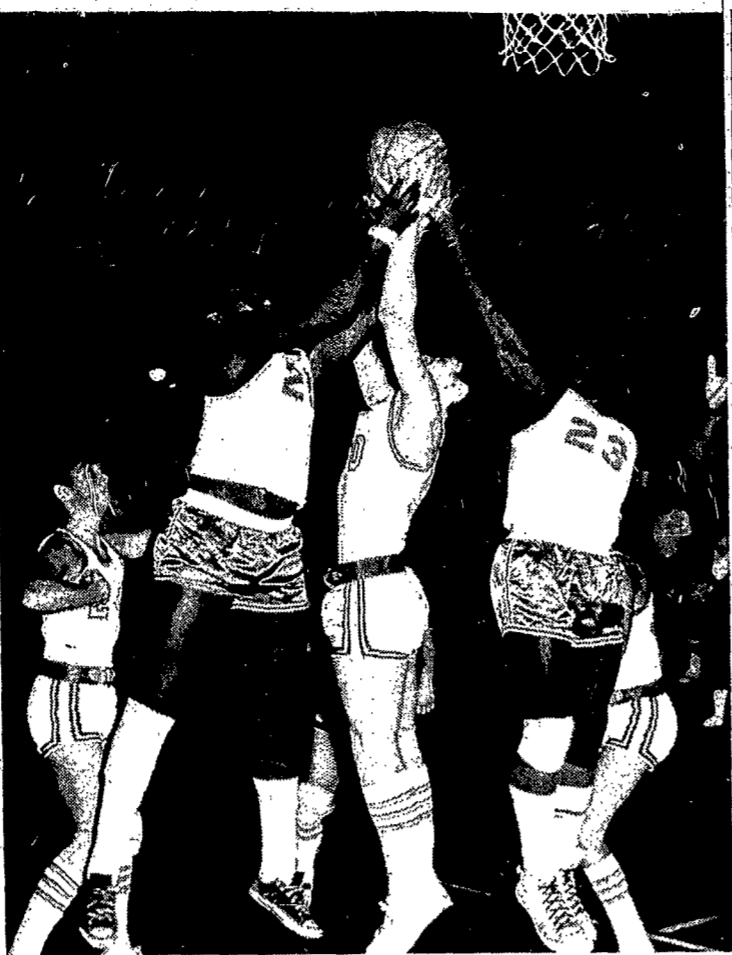
The team sang "For He's a Jolly Good Fellow," and award-

ed Nietopski a cake after the big win over East. In win 100 and No. 10 for the present season, the "Big Red" defense did the trick again.

The return of East star Willy Grimes had little effect on the tough Mooney zone, as it held him to only 10 points.

The performances of Ken Wehner and Dick Poinan caught the eyes of the crowd Saturday, as Wehner hit for 20 points, half from the free-throw line. Poinan's all-round play had 16 points and 10 rebounds and was pretty much responsible for the checking of Grimes.

Mooney now has possession of second place in the CC League behind Franklin with a 10-1 record.

Knights Stung 47-46

McQuaid was six seconds away from his best basketball weekend of the season last Saturday night. But those final moments produced a game-winning jump shot by Edison's Freddy Collins, stinging the Knights with a 47-46 loss and obscuring much of the satisfaction of the previous night's 70-44 romp over Aquinas.

The Knights now show a 7-6 overall record and remain tied with West at 7-3 in C-C standings. This Friday night they play host to winless Jefferson.

Collins' soft 15-footer wiped out a dramatic McQuaid effort which had just sent the Knights ahead with 2 buckets in 25 seconds. Edison had taken a 45-42 lead with 45 seconds left on a jumper by Dave Everet, only to have McQuaid fight back on a corner jumper by Tom Combs and a steal-layup by John McLane to edge ahead, 46-45 with 20 seconds to go. Edison's first offensive thrust saw a near interception on a ball deflected out-of-bounds, but the Inventors retained possession and set Collins up smoothly for his decisive shot.

McQuaid had led for most of the game, opening up a 32-23 lead late in the third period with one of their top defensive jobs of the year. An Edison press, however, coupled with Mike Ryan's temporary absence on 4 fouls, gave the visitors three steals and the spark they needed to seize the initiative. They finally went ahead for the first time, 39-38, on a goal by Collins with 5 minutes left, and the see-saw prevailed until the action-packed last minute.

The night before, the Knights appeared headed for a real dogfight with the Little Irish when the scoreboard showed 16-16 with 16 minutes left in the half. But Ryan's push shot gave McQuaid the lead, and the score shot up to 30-18 by halftime, with John Duignan's jumper being the only Aquinas tally for the whole 6 minutes.

Duignan led an Irish rally to within 33-24 early in the third quarter, but Ryan broke the spell with 2 fouls, and 2 jumpers by Combs sparked a 9-point run that raised the margin to 44-25. It was no contest after that.
