School Basketball Irish Wallop West

An inspired effort gained Aquinas Institute's basketball team its ninth victory of the season with a 92-71 upset over West High School last Friday night at the old R.I.T. gymnasium.

Playing one of their best games of the season, the Irish pumped in 33 points in the last quarter to put the game out of reach. Down 60-59 at the end of the third quarter, hustling Tom Rowig obliged coach John Ulrich by scoring 11 points to lead the rally. Sharpshooter Tom Heil popped in 9 points and the Irish were able to coast the rest of the way.

Aquinas, which went 40-for-85 from the field, were led by

Heil's game high total of 29 points, his best production of the season. Brady Spetz scored 21 and Tom Rowig accounted for 17.

In the junior varsity preliminary, Aquinas' jayvees jumped off to an early start and had little trouble bouncing the West juniors, 64-49. Bill Walsh led the Irish with 13 points.

Tonight Aquinas hosts second ranked and Catholic League champions Cardinal Mooney at the old R.I.T. gymnasium on Spring St. for the second half of a home and home series. Mooney owns the first half of the series with a victory over the Irish in mid-December. Game time is set for 8:30 p.m. with a JV prelim starting at 7 p.m.

Kings Down Lakers

Bishop Kearney, relying on strength under the boards, took charge early and put the Irish away 68-52, at Charlotte last Friday. The Lakers rallied briefly in the fourth quarter, but King substitutes extinguished the fire. Kearney improved their record to a 6-3 overall mark, and the win was their fourth against seven defeats in the City-Catholic League.

Kearney shot 43% from the field and grabbed 59 rebounds on Friday with Junior Paul Riesenberger starting in the win. The substitutes came in

early, collecting seventeen points and fifteen rebounds in the course of the game. John Maurer, Mike Noonan, and Larry Rogers tallied fourteen, thirteen and eleven points in the winning effort. Keith Dillard led the Lakersides with a fourteen point effort.

McQuaid High to Be Host to Wrestlers

McQuaid Jesuit High will play host this Saturday to the sixth annual Inter-Diocesan Wrestling Tournament, bringing together eight Catholic school squads from Western New York.

Cardinal Mooney, currently running even with defending champion Madison in City-Catholic competition, rules the favorite, and McQuaid a strong contender. Indications are that strong competition will come from five visiting squads: Bishop Walsh of Olean; Christian Brothers Academy and Bishop Grimes, both of Syracuse; Notre Dame of Elmira, and Seton Catholic of Endicott. Completing the eight-team field is defending champion Bishop Kearney, beaten decisively this season by McQuaid and Mooney but expected to make its presence felt in a tournament that it has won all 5 times.

McQuaid Coach John Roselli, tourney coordinator, has scheduled preliminary rounds for noon, followed by semifinals. Consolation matches will begin the night activity at 7 p.m., with finals to follow.

Should the championship battle come down to a Mooney-McQuaid duel, the Cards will have 2 undefeated men going for them in heavyweight Mark Urbanos and 188-pound Dave DiBacco, as well as once-beaten Glenn Jones (127) and John Walker (158). McQuaid's strength lies in its lightweights, led by unbeaten Keith Bader 109 and Jeff Frank, who has lost just once, at 127 pounds.
