Following is a transcript of a letter Pope Paul VI sent to the Vatican Secretariat of State on the subject of priests. My Lord Cardinal, The declarations made by Holland, recently about celibacy have profound and have raised in our hearts questions. The reasons for such a contrary to the holy law of our Latin Church, it brings about among God as a whole, part of the clergy and the people are preparing for the repercussions it will have on Christians and even members of the human race. Such declarations deal of trouble and therefore, it is for us an urgent duty to state very clearly our attitude toward a mysterious doubt. Providence has placed our cult hour "the care of our" (2 Corinthians, 11, 28). The reasons advanced radical a change of the old rule, bearer of grace, sanctifying apostolate, are well-known reasons, we must state, do not seem to us fact, they seem to omit and essential condition it is of paramount importance.
