11 Holy Cross Sets

McQuaid's wrestlers, runners up for five years out of six in the Interdiocesan Tournament, finally came away with the championship trophy last Saturday to climax their best season ever.

Five Knights took top honors among the 12 weight classes as McQuaid edged Cardinal Mooney, 72-68, for first place in the eight-team field. The victory came on top of a 12-2 regular-season record, marred only by losses to Mooney and Madison.

Sophomore Rick Caschetto (101 pounds) started the Knights on their way in the finals of the day-long competi-

tion when he bested Bob Walsh of Kearney in a tense 5-0 overtime match. Keith Bader followed with a victory that maintained his unbeaten string at 29 matches, and Jeff Frank and Bill Fackelman came through with wins to give McQuaid 4 of the first 5 championships.

The Knights were to get only one more, but that came in the only head-on meeting between McQuaid and Mooney in the finals. Senior Pete Meade clinched the meet for his team by pinning Mooney's John Fritsch for the 168-pound title. The Cards finished strong on wins by Dave DiBacco and Mark Urbanas in the last two

matches but fell short by four points.

Urbanas, who just two days earlier had suffered his first loss of the season, bounced back with three pins in the
