Bishop Neylon to Be Main Speaker at Jesuit Mission Dinner

Bishop Martin J. Neylon, SJ, coadjutor of the Vicariate Apostolic of Caroline-Marshall Islands, will be principal speaker at the fifth annual McQuaid-Jesuit Missions dinner March 16 at the Flagship Hotel. The tiny islands of the Carolines and Marshalls, 2400 in all are scattered over 2,500,000 square miles of ocean—an area almost as extensive as continental United States. Of the 70,000 inhabitants, about 30,000 are Catholic. There are 46 Jesuit priests, brothers and scholastics laboring there. Transportation is by plane, ship, motor boat or canoe. Nine languages are spoken. Many islands have very little contact even today with the commerce of the outside world. Bishop Neylon was in Rochester two weeks ago to offer a Mass of Thanksgiving and to help plan for the dinner. A native of Buffalo and a 1937 graduate of Canisius College, he entered the Society of Jesus that year and was ordained in 1950. He was ordained a bishop Feb. 2 in St. Patrick's Cathedral, New York City.

St. John Fisher Sets Up Governance Committee

Governance "of the people, by the people and for the people" at the college level will be studied by a blue ribbon committee named this week by the Very Rev. Charles J. Lavery, president of St. John Fisher College. The college's board of trustees have established the Governance Study Committee (GSC) consisting of faculty members, administrators and students. Harold S. Hacker, director of the Rochester Public Library and Monroe County Library System, will be chairman. Vice chairmen are Stefan Maczynski, chairman of the Department of Political Science, and Robert Bergin, president of the Student Board of Administration. The purpose of the committee is to meet and "make recommendations to the Board of Trustees outlining alternative plans of organization of the internal structure of the college, specifying the proper scope of authority and jurisdiction of the faculty, the student body, the administration and any other significant body or group which the committee may recommend be organized," according to President Lavery. Although the committee will be limited to these purposes, in the course of its study it may examine and present findings with respect to the proper relationships of the faculty, the student body and the administration to the Board of Trustees. Besides Hacker, Maczynski and Bergin, others on the committee are Rev. Joseph Dorsey, college vice president, Dr. Clarence Heiningger, Joseph Valenti and Ronald Proud, administration; Dr. Edward Gassner, Dr. Joseph Martinez and Donald Muenich, faculty; David Kinyon, Edward Wurtz and Michael Ryan, student body.
