Career Day at Mooney

What are the job prospects? How many years of study are required? What subjects should I be taking now to prepare for this career? These questions were answered for Cardinal Mooney students at their first schoolwide "career day" recently, when 60 speakers from schools, businesses and professions conducted information sessions there.

Each Mooney student could select two sessions, 45 minutes each, representing his or her fields of interest: teaching, health careers, business, journalism, social sciences, political science, fine arts, entertainment world, industrial apprenticeship programs, home economics, conservation, engineering and science, technology, airline careers, military service, religious witness.

Among lecturers were Mrs. Virginia Magill, Greece Olympia High School (secondary education); Fred Eckert, Greece Town Supervisor (government); William Burns, Rochester Institute of Technology (medical technology); Miss Kathy O'Toole, Democrat and Chronicle (reporting, editing); Sister M. Pius, Rochester Sisters of Mercy (drama); Dick Burt, WROC (television and radio); Dean Lawrence Conjar, University of Detroit (engineering); Sergeant Robert Stone, U.S. Air Force; Miss Barbara Burns, graduate of Miss McCarthy's Secretarial School (executive secretary); Robert Shaw, Cardinal Mooney High School, (Peace Corps).

For girls, sessions on modeling, hair dressing, interior decorating, nursing, teaching and stewardess programs were featured; boys found insurance computer programming, industrial apprenticeship, law enforcement and conservation of interest. Films and sample demonstrations were used by some of the speakers.

Sister Published Again

"Out of Personalism: a People," an article appearing in the March issue of the monthly magazine "Sisters Today," is authored by Rochester nurse, Sister Marie Raymond, mother-house coordinator of the Sisters of Mercy here.

The article, originally published in 1968, was reprinted in 1969 in French in the Bon Secours School of Nursing quarterly journal, Geneva, Switzerland, as "the best article on this matter... concise and showing an extremely interesting and new approach to psychiatric nursing care."

Sister Marie Raymond previously was psychiatric consultant nurse at St. James Mercy Hospital in Hornell, while serving as a full-time staff member of the Steuben County Mental Health Clinic in Bath.

Sister Kristin Gets Post At Hospital

Sister Mary Kristin Grzymkowski, RSM, has been named senior therapist in the speech correction clinic at Strong Memorial Hospital. One of the three full-time speech pathologists at the hospital, Sister Mary Kristin first joined the staff in September.

Sister Kristin and the other therapists are available to all patients at the hospital.

Sister's special training and interest is in the problem of speech in relation to the physiology of the brain. She organized a special program to study this speech-coordinated relationship at Our Lady of Mercy grammar school, and is working with such a program with 3- and 4-year-olds at Strong.

"Superstar" by Andrew Lloyd Webber and Tim Rice is starting the pop music 70's off with one whole question: Who is Jesus Christ?
The Decca 45, sung by Murray Head with a backup of the Trinidad Singers, is of song from an in-development rock opera titled "Jesus Christ." And it's raising storm.
Aware that many radio stations are very reluctant to play records in which Christ's name is used, regardless of the context, Decca has launched a campaign of educating clergymen to convince di's and listeners that rock and religion can be just as compatible as rock and roll.
And the clergy respond well.
Father John Owens of B mark, N.D., who hosts a radio show, circulated a statement that said in part:
"If Jesus Christ means anything at all to a Christian, this record should be listened to with respect and admiration. The superior Christians, when they hear 'Superstar,' will rise up with indignation against the use of the name of Jesus Christ in such a public way. But an Webber and Tim Rice have done Christianity a favor.
"They will have many kids rocking and chanting the name of Someone who never objected or rejected a 'young' that came into the world. Too bad the same or not, he said of some Christian parents and adults today."
Behind the objection Ither Owens answers, however there is another issue."
