New Classrooms Busy

Livonia—More than 300 Catholic high school and elementary students of St. Joseph's parish here are receiving religious instruction in a new eight-class room building opened last October.

Father Roy Hegarty, pastor, noted that the property was purchased and the building erected through years-long sacrifice of the parishioners. Total costs approximated \$90,000.

The St. Joseph's Catechetical Center is situated on a half-acre plot adjacent to the Livonia high and elementary schools. Constructed of block and brick, it measures 50 by 100 feet.

Featuring the center is a series of folding walls which when closed house the eight classrooms and when opened will allow for seating 300 persons. The building also contains an office and kitchen.

The structure has been a boon to the task of providing religious instruction, Father Hegarty declared. Previously, he said, the nearly 50 volunteer teachers have had to assemble the youngsters in various parts of the village for such instruction—in the parish church, in other churches, in the firehouse or in private homes.

Responsibility for religious instruction is handled by a parish catechetical council for which Father Hegarty is advisor. Officers are Thomas McNamara, president; Louis Nesbitt, vice president; Mrs. George Hetzler, secretary, and Donald Burkhardt, treasurer.
