Catholic Lay Group Hears Bishop Hogan

Bishop Hogan was the guest of the Rochester Association of Catholic Laymen prior to his regular meeting Tuesday, March 12, at St. John Fisher College.

On arrival the Bishop moved about the room for a half hour, chatting personally with RACL members. He then was presented for remarks by Robert McLaughlin, association president.

Expressing appreciation at the opportunity to talk with the group, the Bishop commended the interest and zeal of its members in the progress and welfare of the Church.

After answering a number of questions about liturgy, integrated education, the Catholic school system, the diocesan newspaper, religious instruction, racism and other topics, the Bishop closed his informal visit by reiterating his pleasure at attending and declared he would look forward to another visit.

General comment following his departure reflected a majority view that he had answered questions readily and frankly and that the fact of his visit was a step in the direction of more dialogue between clergy and laity.

Holy Week Schedule Listed at Cathedral

Bishop Hogan will officiate at Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter rites at Sacred Heart Cathedral. His schedule:

Palm Sunday, March 22 — Blessing of Palms, 10 a.m.; Mass, 10:15 a.m.

Holy Thursday, March 26 — Christa Mass, 12 noon; Mass, 7:30 p.m. Good Friday — Liturgy of the Lord's Passion, 1:30 p.m. Holy Saturday — Easter Vigil, 7:30 p.m.; Mass of Resurrection, 8:30 p.m.

Easter Sunday — Easter Mass, 10:15 a.m.

There will be a low Mass and Holy Communion on Holy Thursday at 6:45 a.m.

Musical programs will allow for the singing of traditional hymns, psalms and responses by both choir and congregation, Father John S. Hayes, Cathedral rector, pointed out.

The Cathedral Boys Choir under the direction of William Ferris will perform works of Palestrina, Billings, Bach and Sowerby in addition to leading and complementing the congregation in the celebration of the Sacred Mysteries.

The Easter Sunday Mass will be highlighted by performances of "The Earth Feared and Was Silent"; an offertory anthem for Easter day composed by Ferris, and the "Halleluia Chorus" from the "Messiah."

Father James M. Moynihan,

diocesan chancellor, noted last week that Bishop Hogan has granted the following permissions in accordance with faculties given him by the Holy See:

Holy Thursday — One low Mass may be celebrated in the morning, but only in parish churches; Holy Communion may be distributed during or immediately after Mass. Solemn services should be held between 4 and 9 p.m.

Good Friday — The liturgical services may be repeated.

Easter Vigil services may be celebrated early Sunday morning.

The annual collection for the Holy Land will be taken at the Good Friday service.

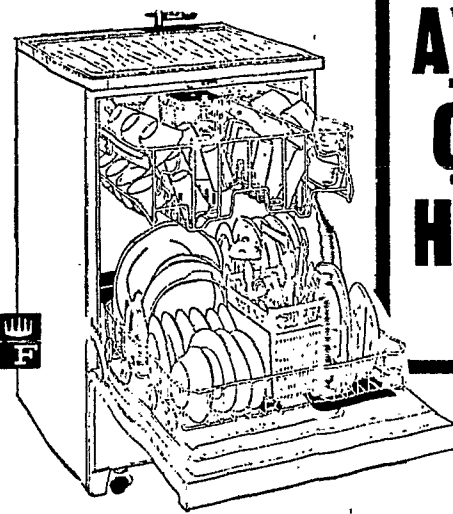
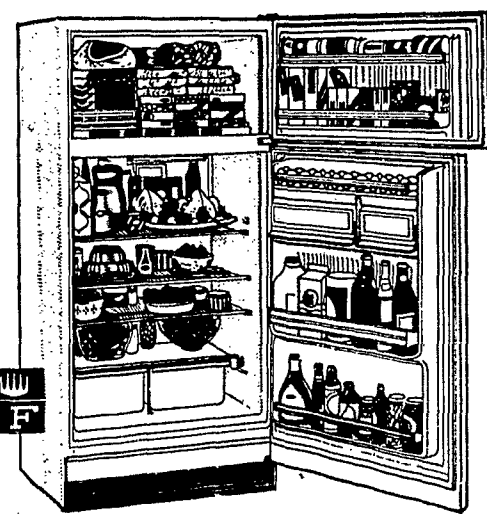
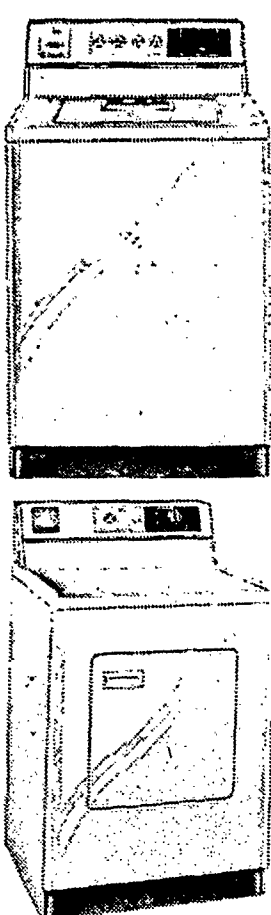
