Priests to Attend Marriage Symposium

Priests of the diocese will attend a two-day symposium on marriage next month at the Notre Dame Retreat House in Canandaigua.

In order to accommodate all priests, the overnight program is scheduled three times, with the clergy being asked by Bishop Hogan to select one of the three — Monday and Tuesday, April 13-14; Thursday and Friday, April 16-17, or Monday and Tuesday, April 20-21.

Registration is slated at 2 p.m. and the conferences will be concluded at noon the following day with celebration of Mass and lunch.

Among speakers will be Father Edward Kohler, Washington, D.C., national chaplain of the Christian Family Movement.

Red Cross Needs Drivers

A need for Red Cross volunteer drivers is felt especially in the blood donor program, Clarence Dutton, chairman of the transportation service, said this week.

"The shortage of these drivers is particularly acute at this time," Dutton said. "Housewives and retired men and women who are able to give one day every other week, would be of real assistance."

"I am shepherding the whole diocese, and I am going to haunt every inch of it," the Bishop said at the Auburn supper meeting. "We cannot afford division — we need unity," he added.
