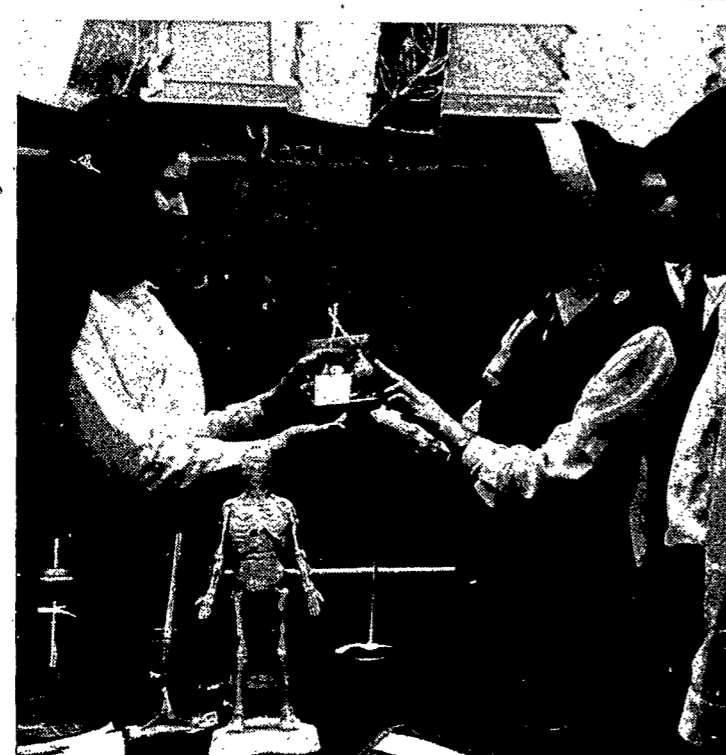

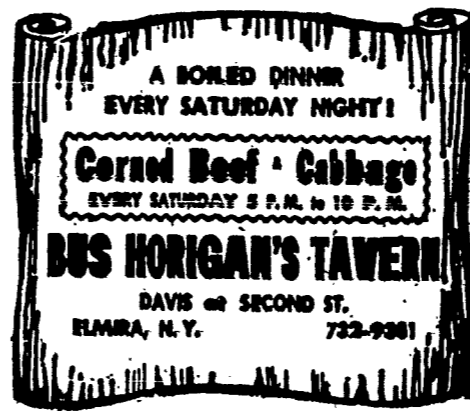

One of the most important in-service events for CCD personnel is the Lay Catechists Institute, which is scheduled this year for April 25, at Mercy High School, Rochester, N.Y. The program is highlighted by addresses by Father Anthony Padovano and by Dr. and Mrs. J. C. Wilke.

Dr. and Mrs. Wilke may be familiar to many of you from their records on sex education and their book, "The Wonder of Sex." Their presentation will be given in two sessions, one at 11:15 a.m. and one at 2:30 p.m. Their talks should be very helpful to teachers and to all parents present. Their books will be available for purchase or order.

Father Padovano is a well known author. His writings were used as the basis of an Ecumenical Lenten study group in the Gates area. His address is scheduled for 10:15 a.m. and promises an informative and inspiring insight into the contem-

porary practice of Christianity.

An informal, but important part of the institute is the exhibit hall. The exhibits open at 9:00 and remain open throughout the day. Since the first formal session, the general session opening the program, does not convene until 10 a.m., early comers will have an hour to view these exhibits in the morning in addition to other times throughout the day. Exhibitors offer educational and A-V material.

A box lunch will be served during two lunch periods. During the lunch periods there will be film previews and of course, the exhibits will be open.
