Frank R. Davis Dies Active Lay Churchman

Two bishops and nine priests officiated April 2 in Holy Rosary Church at Mass for repose of the soul of Frank R. Davis, 81, widely known Catholic layman and father of Father Francis R. Davis, pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes Church, Elmira.

Mr. Davis died of a heart attack on March 30, 1970, at his home 292 Lake View Pk. He was superintendent of the Rochester Bureau of Buildings from 1948 until his retirement 10 years later.

Bishop James E. Kearney presided at the Mass, and Auxiliary Bishop John E. McCafferty pronounced the absolution. Father Davis was principal celebrant, and concelebrants included Msgr. Richard K. Burns and Fathers Robert A. Meng, L. James Callan, Edward J. Foy, James P. Collins, C. Richard Nangle, Thomas H. Wheeland and Herman Siebert, OFM. Conv. Father Siebert is a Rochester priest temporarily home from his mission in Brazil.

Mr. Davis was a parishioner at Holy Rosary Church for 58 years and head usher for 28 years until his death. He was a director of the diocesan-wide Family Rosary for Peace radio program and a member of the Monday night Rosary For Peace group at Holy Rosary.

He once was chosen outstanding Catholic Layman of the Year by the Monroe County Chapter of Catholic War Veterans. Among organizations in which he was active for decades were the diocesan Holy Name Society, Nocturnal Adoration Society, Laymen's Retreat League, Knights of Columbus, Catholic Boy Scouts, Legion of Mary Auxiliary and Third Order of Mt. Carmel.

Born in Cuba, N.Y., Mr. Davis came to Rochester in 1920 after graduating from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in 1913, working as an engineer in New York City's transit department and later in Washington D.C. in the Bureau of Yards and Docks during World War I. He also worked a year at Eastman Kodak Co. before joining the city engineering department.

In 1935 he was cited for

outstanding service to the Police Athletic League, in its efforts to promote recreation and social opportunities for youngsters in the city. In 1956 he received an award from the state's Joint Legislative Committee on Housing for what was termed "distinguished public service and recognition for advancement of health and safety in the field of housing."

Mr. Davis leaves his wife, Ruth M. (Donovan) Davis; two sons, Father Davis and John E. Davis of Rochester; four daughters, Ruth M., Barbara A. and Janet T. Davis, and Mrs. Richard (Virginia) Mahns, all of Rochester; a brother, John L. of Rochester, five grandchildren and a niece and nephew.

Brother Bernard Passes at 57, Ex-Rochesterian

Brother Bernard Thomas Kelly, 57, a former Rochesterian and an associate professor of physics at Manhattan College in the Bronx, died of a heart attack in his room there on March 28, 1970.

Brother Bernard, a native of Troy, was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. John F. Kelly of Manitou Road, Greece.

A graduate of Aquinas Institute, he entered the Brothers of the Christian Schools in 1935. He was graduated from Catholic University in Washington in 1939, received a master of science degree there in 1943 and a doctor of philosophy degree in 1957.

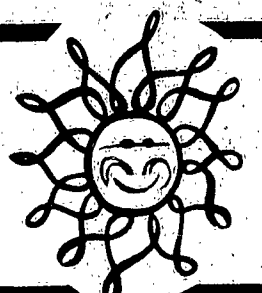
Before joining the Manhattan College faculty in 1956, Brother Bernard taught at Christian Brothers' schools in New York City, Washington, Brooklyn and Albany.
