Father Groppi Freed from Jail Term

Milwaukee — (RNS) — Father James E. Groppi, the militant civil rights priest, was freed by a federal judge in Madison from a charge of contempt against the Wisconsin Assembly, growing out of a demonstration last September protesting state welfare cuts.

Federal Judge James E. Doyle said the legislature had failed to provide minimum due process for the priest, who was jailed 3½ days on the order of members of the Assembly.

"I conclude that such punishment may not be imposed by a legislature without at least providing the accused with some minimal opportunity to appear and to respond to a charge," Judge Doyle said.

State officials indicated that the decision will be appealed.

Father Groppi said, "I am quite happy. I have no desire to go to jail if I can help it."

Meanwhile the Milwaukee Archdiocese announced that St. Boniface parish, where Father Groppi serves, will be taken over June 1 by a team of black priests, headed by Father Kenneth Stewart, O.F.M., Cap.

Father Groppi said he was totally in favor of the appointment. "I think," the militant priest said, "that the black community has to be given a chance to develop on its own and black leaders have to develop, whether they are churchmen or youth leaders or whatever."

Father Groppi said he thought it would be tragic if all white priests were to leave the black community, but said he would probably do whatever he was asked, even if it meant going to a parish in a conservative white community.

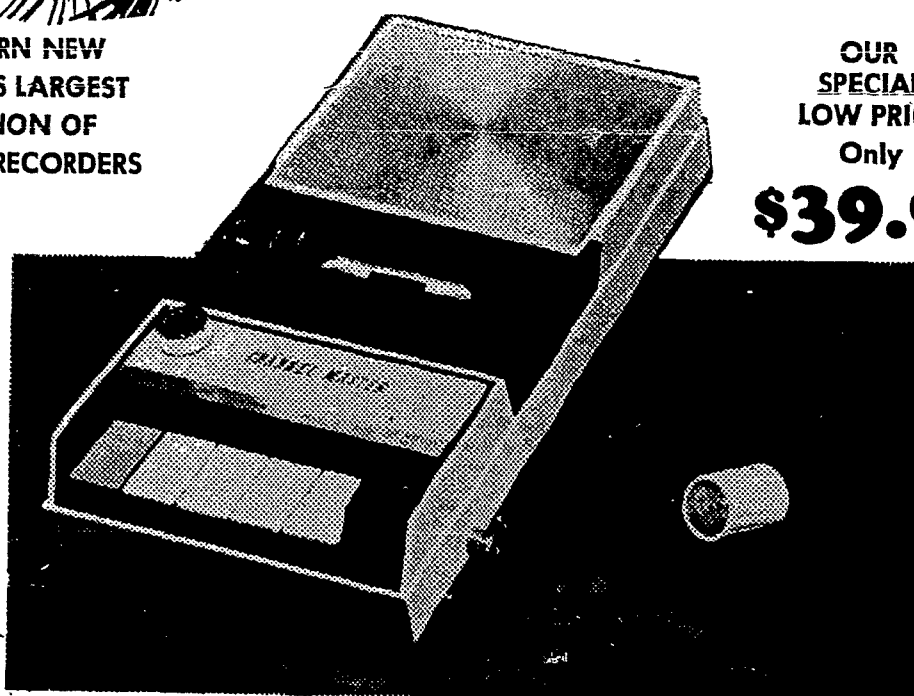
