Aquinas Opens Track Season

For over a month, in spite of dull, grey skies, snow, rain and sleet, Aquinas runners and jumpers have been flexing their muscles and showing their teeth. Now, with the advent of good weather, the Little Irish trackmen take on their first opponent, Webster, this afternoon at the Webster school field. Starting time is 4 p.m.

The coach of the Dewey Avenue boys is Father Donald McCarthy, CSB, who excels at gauging a man's potential and getting all that's to be got out of him. The only thing he abhors more than an exhausted runner is a tense runner. Consequently, he devotes as much attention to his squad's mental attitude as he does to their physical condition.

Few schools will be able to take Aquinas in the jumps and

hurdles. Returning are Tom Sextone, one of the top high jumpers in the area; Al Shea, an outstanding hurdler, and speedy Paul Ford. All three were named All-Catholic last season. In all, Father McCarthy has 23 returning lettermen. Another trackman who has shown promise is sprinter Tom Rapp, who was named all-Diocesan two years ago.

Assisting Father McCarthy is Gerry Gears, coach of the Aquinas swimming team which concluded a 17.0 record this winter. Gears holds the Aquinas record in the 120-yard low hurdles and the 180-yard low hurdles which he set in 1962 while a senior at Aquinas.

Last year Aquinas posted a 6 and 3 record in dual meets. Saturday, April 18, Aquinas will participate in the annual Penfield relays at the Penfield school.

A Rochester diocesan priest has been named deputy chief of chaplains for the U.S. Air Force.

He is Chaplain (Brig. Gen.) John F. Albert, a native Rochesterian who has been an Air Force chaplain since 1945. He has been serving since 1967 at the Strategic Air Force Command headquarters at Offutt AFB, Nebraska.

Monsignor Albert attended Holy Cross School and St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries. He was ordained June 7, 1941, and was an assistant at St. Mary's Church, Corning, before entering military service.


