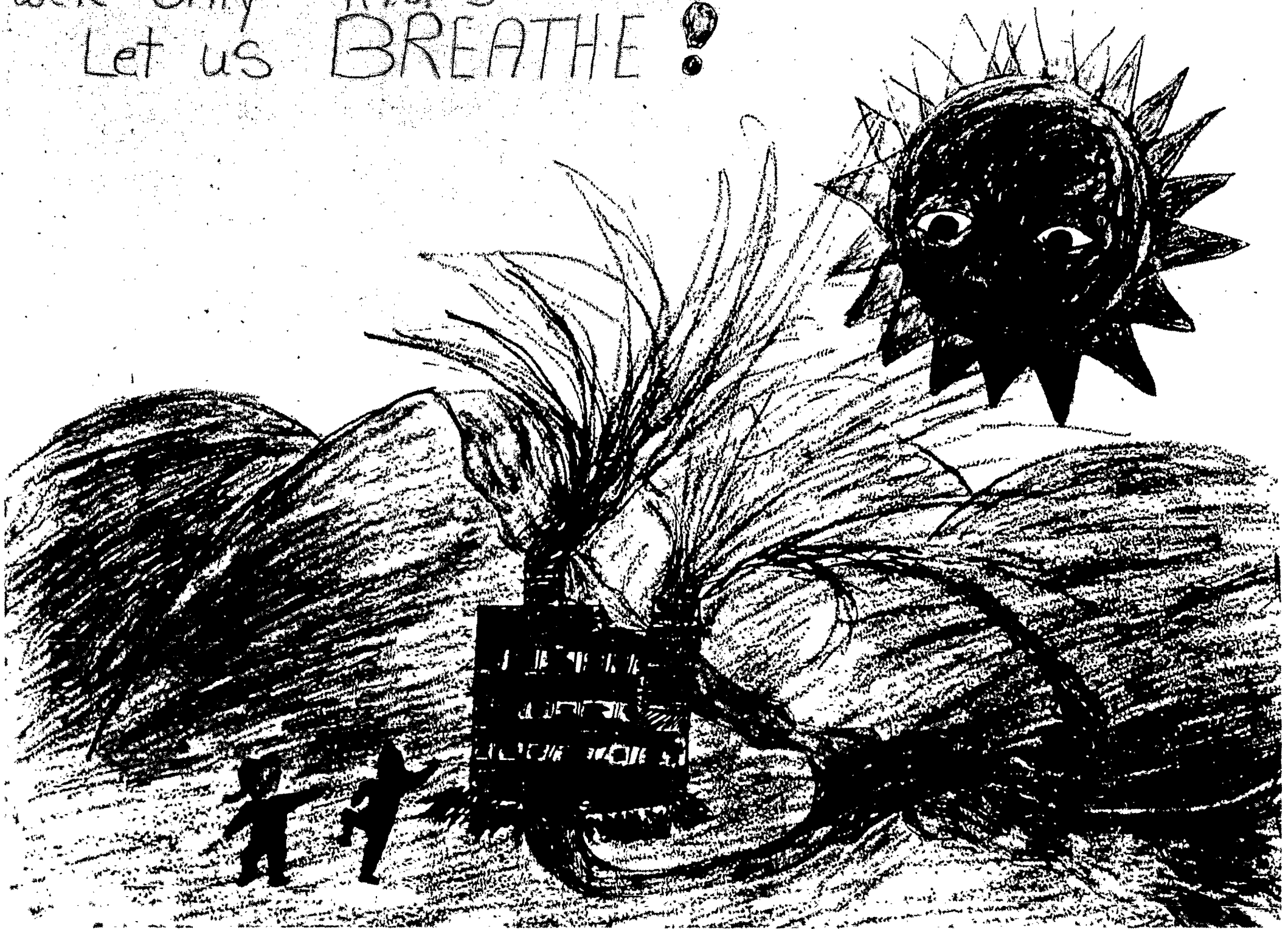

Father Greeley Starts May 6 In Courier

Father Andrew M. Greeley, one of the nation's top Catholic authors and priest-sociologists, will be a regular columnist in the *Courier-Journal*. His weekly commentaries will begin May 6.

Father Greeley's column, "The Church - 1970", will range in interest over the many events of the Church and the world in these fast moving days. More than a dozen books and scores of widely read articles in national publications have made Father Greeley one of the most respected Catholic writers working today. His weekly column appears in more than 40 Catholic newspapers.

Father Greeley is program director of the National Opinion Research Center at the University of Chicago, where he also is connected with the department of sociology. His research center is now working on a major study of the priestly ministry under a commission of the United States Catholic Bishops.

In addition to his frequent lectures and his writing Father Greeley is a consultant to the Cana Conference and to the Catholic Action Office of the Chicago Archdiocese.

Bp. Hogan Arrives In San Francisco

San Francisco — An eye-opening, 18-day visitation to Latin America behind him, Bishop Hogan arrived here Sunday evening to participate in the U.S. Bishops' spring conference on national affairs of the Church.

Nearly 225 Cardinals and Bishops from the entire nation, including Rochester's Auxiliary Bishops Dennis W. Hickey and John E. McCafferty, will attend the sessions at the Fairmont Hotel here from Monday, the 20th, through Friday noon.

Bishop Hogan and his auxiliaries will return to Rochester late Friday evening.
