

Montessori Open House

There will be an Open House at Trinity Montessori School, 110 French Road, in Pittsford, on Sunday, April 26, from 2 to 5 p.m. Faculty and parents will be on hand to answer questions and demonstrate materials, while pictures and slides will show the young students at work.

Trinity Montessori School, owned and directed by the Sisters of St. Joseph of Rochester, was opened in 1967, and is one of four Montessori schools in

the Rochester area. It takes pre-primary children of all races, nationalities, and religious affiliations, and presently has 44 students, each attending the half-day session. Because of the interest in, and demand for, this early education, a third class will be opened next year at Trinity.

Mass Concelebrated For J. Norman Burke

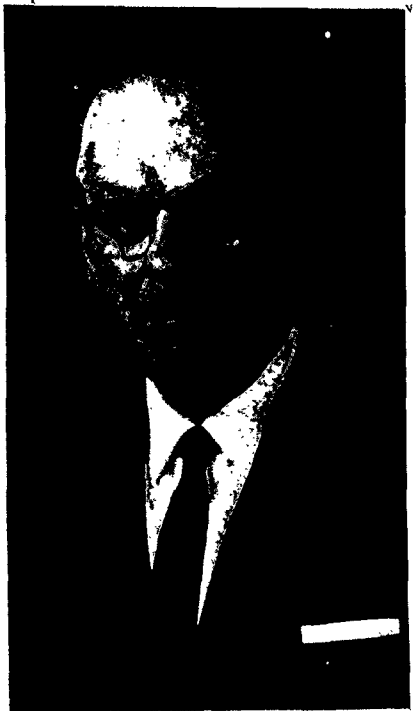
Mass for repose of the soul of J. Norman Burke, 66, of 42 Mayflower St., was concelebrated April 8 in Sacred Heart Cathedral.

Mr. Burke was killed Saturday night, April 4, 1970, when struck by a car on Ridge Road West. He retired last year from Eastman Kodak Co., after 27 years at its distribution center.

Concelebrants of the Mass were the Very John S. Hayes, Cathedral rector, and Fathers Richard Hart, Phillip Billotte, Thomas Sykes, Edward Zimmer and Robert O'Neill.

Mr. Burke was a member of the Cathedral Men's Club, chairman of the parish ushers, and a member of the nocturnal Adoration Society, the Rochester Laymen's Retreat League and the Hibernian Club. He was active in the 100th Ward Democratic Committee.


