

Aquinas '9' Looks To Winning Season

The Aquinas Institute baseball team is shooting for its 11th straight winning season and despite a couple of question marks, the team could well do it.

With only a handful of returnees, Coach Michael Piehler will have to rely on a number of underclassmen. Piehler is a Basilian scholastic, now in his second season as baseball coach at Aquinas. He is assisted by two St. Bernard's seminarians, William Leone and James McSweeney.

The pitching staff, which offers five players, is also a question mark as is the team's overall hitting and defense.

Heading the list of returnees is senior Bill Falandays. The 5-foot-10-inch, 190-pound veteran is a second baseman and a powerful hitter.

Falandays' infield mates are Tony Bianchi, a sophomore, at third and junior Tom Rolwing at short. First base is up for grabs with Rich Millerick and Terry Haskins in the running.

Senior Rich Russo figures to be the No. 1 hurler. An All-State football player, Russo is a solid 6-foot, 190-pounder who can hit as well as pitch.

Junior Tony Damelio appears to have the catching spot.

Outfield spots are covered by Rudy Valentino, Chip Comperatore, Mark Skirvin, Carl Ehmann and John Rybezak.

The team opened yesterday against Batavia High School, too late to report in this issue. First City-Catholic league game will be 4 p.m. Friday at West High. Sunday, Aquinas entertains Christian Brothers Academy of Syracuse at 2 p.m.

Aquinas Names Uriah

John Paul Uriah has been named director of athletics of Aquinas Institute, effective July 1. The announcement was made by Aquinas Principal Father Leon G. Hart, C.S.B. and Father Albert Gaelens, C.S.B., who will be principal next year.

Uriah will assume the position left vacant by the resignation of Father Cyril F. Carter, C.S.B., who had the position for 25 years. He guided Aquinas through its era of football glory in the late forties and early fifties. He resigned for reasons of health.

Uriah joined Aquinas in September 1969 as head basketball coach and assistant football coach. Before coming to Aquinas, he had been varsity basketball coach and football line coach at Bishop McCort High School in Johnstown, Pa.

A graduate of Lincoln High School in Bridgeville, Pa., where he lettered in football and basketball, Uriah is a 1961 graduate of the University of Dayton and has done graduate work at the University of Pittsburgh.

Fr. Charbonneau Named Director At Stella Maris

Father William G. Charbonneau, assistant director of Catholic Charities, has been appointed director of Camp Stella Maris, a summer camp for boys and girls on Conesus Lake.

Father Charbonneau graduated from St. Bernard's Seminary and was ordained in 1953. He was first assigned to Our Lady of Lourdes Church in Brighton and in 1956 became assistant pastor at St. Andrew's Church. He joined the staff of the Catholic Charities in 1957, leaving in 1960 to study for his Master's Degree in social work at Catholic University, Washington, D.C. He is assistant to Msgr. Donald J. Mulcahy and directs the Family and Children Division of the Catholic Charities.

Father Charbonneau is looking forward to a successful season for Camp Stella Maris. "We have a fine staff of counselors
