Bath — Bishop Hogan's long interest in scouting was recognized here April 28 as he and two priests were presented with bronze pelican awards.

Bishop Hogan, principal speaker at the 23rd annual report dinner of the diocesan Catholic Committee on Scouting, held in St. Mary's Church hall, is himself an Eagle Scout, and said that the scouting program had his warmest approval.

Nearly 250 scouters and officials of the seven councils serving the diocese attended the dinner, which recognized volunteer service.

Louis A. Langie Sr., of Rochester, a charter member of the diocesan Scouting Committee, was presented with an engraved

bronze medallion for his continued efforts in aiding the work.

Bishop Hogan presented the St. George emblems to recipients, with Edwin G. Harish reading the citations. Father Joseph Brennan, rector of St. Bernard's Seminary, read citations for the bronze pelican recipients.

Among speakers was David Rabideau, a member of Troop 37 sponsored by St. John the Evangelist's Church, Rochester, who spoke on "What Scouting Means to Me."

CYO EXPANDS CAMP PROGRAM

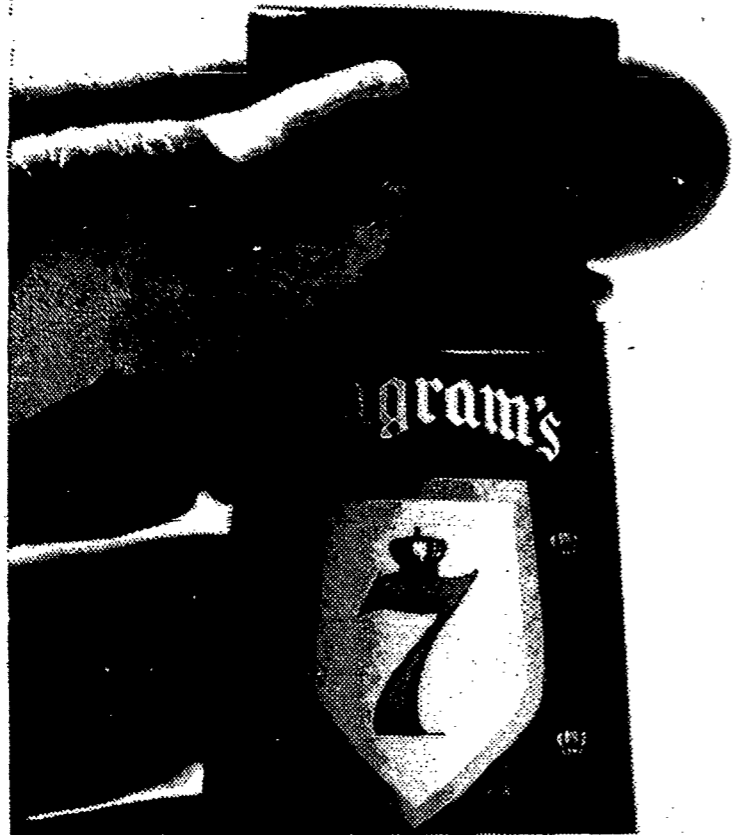

The camps will be located at 50 Chestnut Street, St. Ambrose, Good Shepherd, Mother of Sorrows, Holy Ghost (new camp) and in the innercity Clinton and Joseph Avenue area. All campers will be transported in CYO buses and may register for one or more weeks.

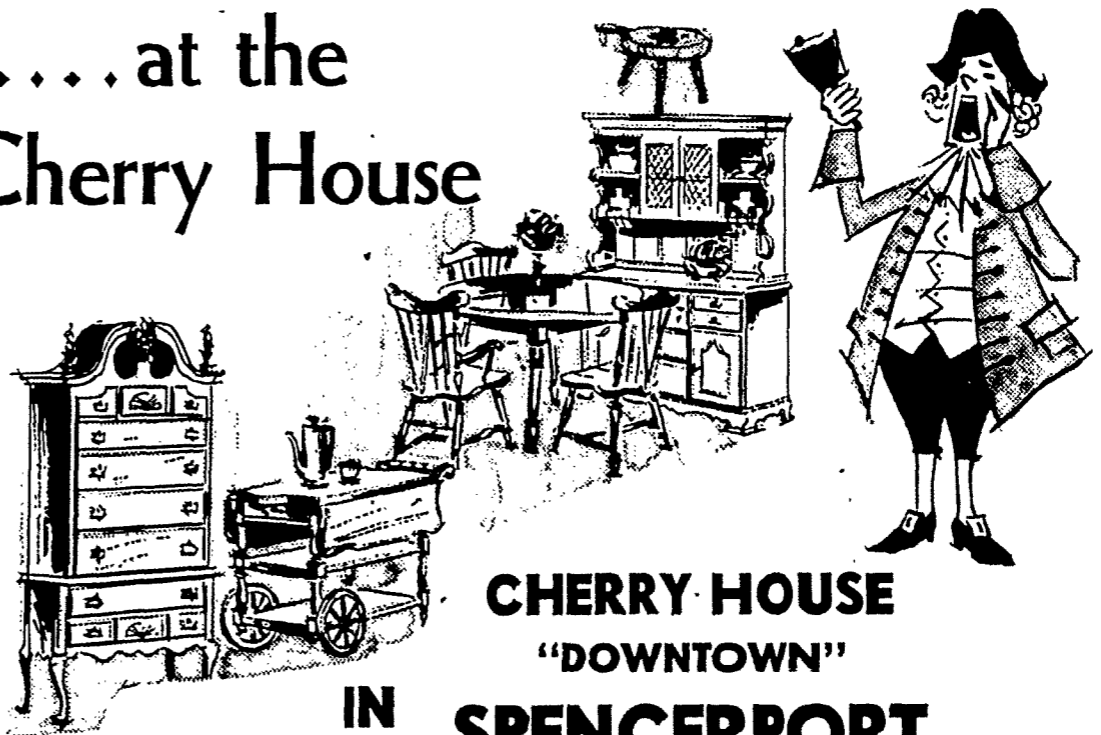
