

Aquinas Relays Set For May 23

Area track buffs literally will have a field day on May 23 when the Aquinas Institute athletic department presents the 7th annual Aquinas Relays at the University of Rochester's Fauver Stadium.

More than 500 boys, many holding school and state records, have been entered from Western and Central New York State schools. Last year more than 25 schools were represented. The entrance parade and opening exercises will begin at 1 p.m.

The relays annually attract outstanding track talent. Under the direction of Father J. Michael Wesley, C.S.B., acting athletic director, this is the largest track event of its kind in upstate New York.

A three-school struggle figures for the title among defending champion McQuaid Jesuit High, Cardinal Mooney and

Christian Brothers Academy of Syracuse. McQuaid breezed to last year's title and may repeat this year, but not without strong opposition from the local track powerhouses. CBA suffered its first loss in 54 meets last month to McQuaid. The following week Cardinal Mooney edged the Knights. Another contender is Bishop Kearney which has strong runners and good depth.

Eight of the nine city public schools, all area Catholic high schools and several county schools will participate as well as schools from Buffalo and Syracuse.

AQUINAS, MOONEY TRACKMEN TO MEET

Aquinas Institute's trackmen, nipped by McQuaid and Bishop Kearney, roared back to defeat East High, 78-48 and Franklin High, 91-31 last week.

Tomorrow (Thursday) Aquinas will face its toughest opposition of the season when the Irish invade Cardinal Mooney territory. The Cardinals, undefeated in the City - Catholic League, are an area track powerhouse. The meet will get under way at 4 p.m.

In the Franklin meet, Aquinas took 10 of 14 first places to put the meet out of reach for the Quakers. The shot-put team of Peter Schlachter, Ron LeBlanc and Brian Donovan finished 1-2-3 for a 9-point total. Strong in field events, Aquinas also captured all three places in the high jump and in the pole vault.

On the freshman level, the Aquinas fledglings continued their winning way, downing McQuaid, 74-61.




