James Capellupo's class went into action. "I divided the 22 children into teams to increase competition," Capellupo said. "Within two months we had mailed in for 22 atlases. We set a goal for 30." The class then realized they

had a good thing going, according to Capellupo. They reset their goal to 50; then 60; then 70. Each child in the class was promised one atlas.

The additional books, they agreed, would be donated to the needy. These books are now going to St. Joseph's Villa in Rochester and the Latin American mission of the Sisters of St. Joseph.

According to Capellupo, the class brought in nearly 1,100 wrappers. Every day meant stuffing them in large manilla envelopes, and a trip to the Post Office.

He reported the value of each atlas is \$13.

"This seven-month project," Capellupo said, "is only one example of what can develop when people work together for a common goal. Age makes no difference when people care for each other."
