

Crozer Seminary To Join Rochester Theology Center

Rochester Center for Theological Studies, which includes St. Bernard's Seminary and Colgate Rochester-Bexley Hall, will add another famed institution next Fall when Crozer Theological Seminary will move its 70 Baptist seminarians and seven faculty members to Rochester.

The 102-year old seminary in Chester, Pa., one of seven seminaries maintained by the American Baptist Convention, will close this summer and sell its property for about \$500,000. Proceeds of the sale will be transferred to the Colgate Rochester-Bexley Hall endowment.

Presently associated in the Rochester Center are St. Ber-

nard's, Colgate Rochester Seminary (Baptist), the Baptist Missionary Training School and Bexley Hall (Episcopal).

The move of the Baptist school to Rochester was announced at the annual meeting of the American Baptist Convention in Cincinnati last Saturday.

It was also announced that the Martin Luther King School of Social Change, associated with Crozer in Chester, plans to move to the Rochester Center campus off Highland Avenue next Fall.

Father Joseph P. Brennan, rector of St. Bernard's is this year's president of the Rochester Center for Theological Studies and Father David M. Murphy, St. Bernard's dean of studies is its secretary.

The cooperation of the Catholic and Protestant seminaries profits each in several ways: mutual use of library facilities of the various schools, exchange of professors for individual courses, joint faculty meetings and opportunity for students and clerics of the area to enroll in courses of the other denominational schools.

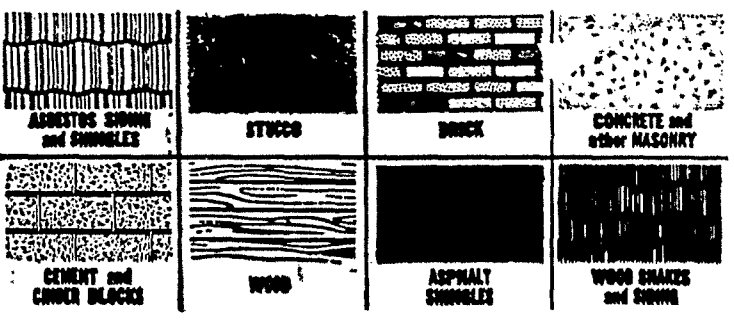

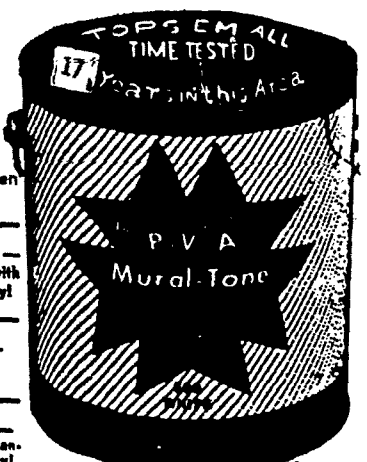
