## Sister Florentia To Note Milestone

Sister Florentia Smead's 60 years as a Sister of St. Joseph will be commemorated at a Mass at 4:30 p.m. Sunday, May 24, in Holy Rosary Church. A reception will follow from 5:30 to 7 p.m. in the parish hall.

Auxiliary Bishop John E. McCafferty, former pastor of Holy Rosary Church, will be principal celebrant of the Mass. Concelebrants will be friends and former pupils of Sister Florentia—Msgr. John E. Maney, Father Michael Connor, CP., of Scranton, Pa., Father Theoph-

ane Larkin, OFM., of St. Bonaventure, Olean, and Father Robert Meng, pastor of Holy Rosary Church.

Born in Geneva, Sister Florentia received the order's habit in August, 1909. She taught in Immaculate Conception School, Rochester, from 1910 to 1930, served as principal at Nativity School in Brockport from 1930 to 1933, and taught from 1933 in Blessed Sacrament School, from 1940, in Holy Apostles, from 1950 in Corpus Christi, and from 1960 to 1968 in Holy Rosary School. Although retired in 1968, she still tutors and fills in as a substitute teacher.
