

Father Brennan's Mother Dies

Three bishops and nearly 20 priests concelebrated a Mass of the Resurrection May 21 in Sacred Heart Cathedral for repose of the soul of Mrs. Mary (May) Brennan, mother of the Very Rev. Joseph P. Brennan, rector of St. Bernard's Seminary, and sister of Msgr. Wilfred T. Craugh, former rector.

Mrs. Brennan, a member of Cathedral parish for nearly 40 years, died May 17, 1970. She was the widow of William J. Brennan, who died in 1952.

Other survivors include a sister, Mrs. Thomas J. Maloney of Cleveland, Ohio; two brothers, Richard F. Craugh of Oklahoma City and Gerald J. Craugh of New York City, and several nieces and nephews.

Bishop Hogan was principal celebrant of the Mass. Bishop James E. Kearney was in the sanctuary. Other concelebrants included Auxiliary Bishops Dennis W. Hickey and John E. McCafferty and the following priests:

Born in Canada, she joined the Sisters of Mercy in 1940. During her novitiate she attended Nazareth College.

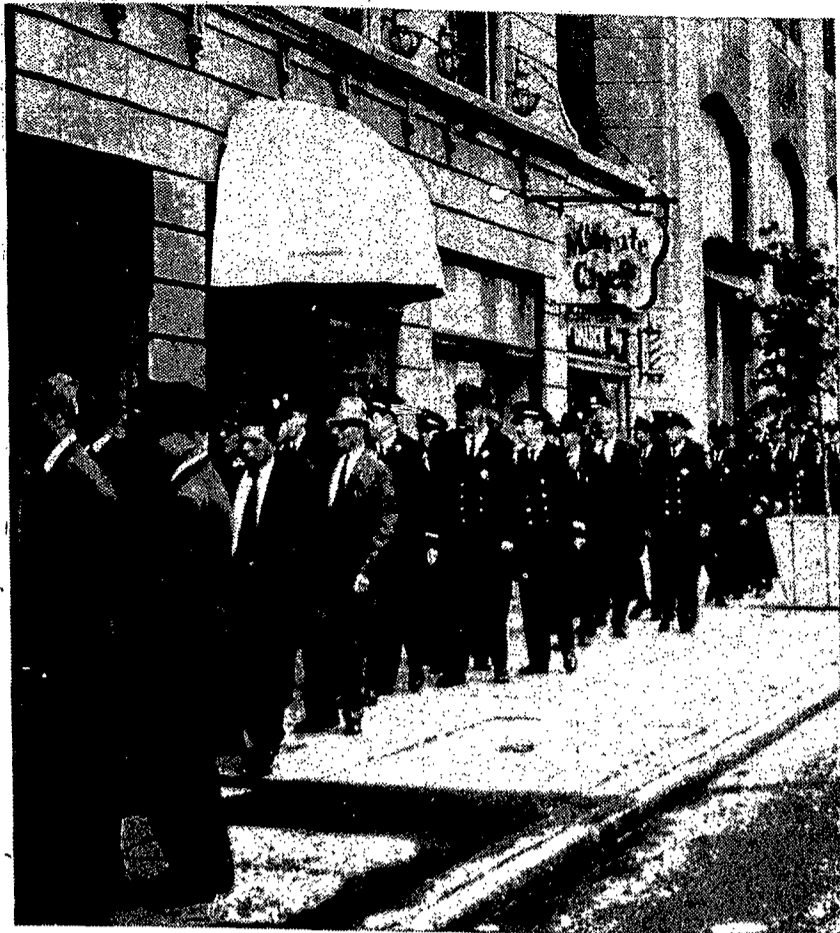
