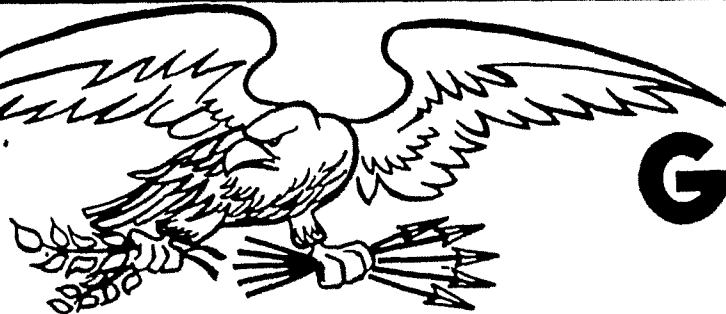
Hospital Shares
