'School' Urged On Holy Days

Diocesan parochial schools have been urged to observe as regular school days three feast days on which previously the schools have been closed.

They are the feasts of All Saints on Nov. 1, the Immaculate Conception on Dec. 8, and the Ascension in May.

Two of the three will occur on regular school days during the 1970-71 semesters. They are Dec. 8 and May 20.

The school office memo suggests that plans be made to make each of the days "a memorable event that should make a lasting impression on the stu-dents." It lists among reasons for keeping school open:

• The parochial school calendar will more easily by synchronized with neighboring public schools, facilitating bus scheduling and avoiding loss of time for Title I teachers.

• It. will allow "creative teachers" to experiment with a special day's programming, such as a special Mass, a "renewal" day, some type of communal penance, discussions, some missionary or apostolic endeavor, a special assembly, or possibly a scripture service by different grade levels.
