## Catholic Vets Urge Sanctions Against Student Violence

Stronger sanctions against "violent and destructive tactics" employed by groups of protesting students was called for in a resolution adopted by the state's Catholic War Veterans at their convention May 14-16 in Rochester.

The resolution demanded that "proper action be taken by our elected officials to protect our fellow citizens and the state and municipal properties from these destructive elements," and that "legal action be insti-

tuted to apprehend those responsible for any damages and that they be made to pay for all damage which has resulted from violent activities."

Another resolution asked Congress to make "desecration of our Country's Flag," or "the rendering of our National Anthem in any manner other than was originally composed," a "crime punishable by law."

Referring to criticisms of religious utterances by Apollo

astronauts, the delegates called on Congress and other public leaders to be "especially on guard to resist increasing tendencies for the removal of religious references from all aspects of public life."

Also adopted was a plea calling for action in Congress on bills designed to fight pornography.

Nearly 150 delegates from posts throughout the state attended the three-day conclave. Nearly 50 delegates also were present for the CWV Auxiliary convention held at the same time.

Miss Marie Logan of St. Andrew's Parish, Rochester, was elected a state aide.

## CMHS Students Reap Honors

The Crest, Cardinal Mooney High School newspaper, received the Democrat and Chronicle trophy for outstanding newspaper in the Rochester area, and a certificate of excellence as first runnerup for best letterpress paper in the St. Bonaventure Press Day competition. Entries came from 300 public and private high schools in twenty states.

Therese Hofmann, co-editor of the Crest, received a certificate of honor from the New York Times for outstanding accomplishment in the field of

journalism. The Myriad, Mooney's literary magazine, also received a New York Times certificate of honor, and individual certificates were awarded to David Fraher, Mary Keymel and Paula Back for poetry, and to Janet Hemdal for art work. Sister Patricia Millerick, R.S.M. is moderator of both publications.

In the musical field, Mooney students received a total of sixteen A ratings, nineteen B ratings and seven C ratings in the New York State School Music Association spring festival during the past few weeks.
